# THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, and in particular points (b) and (d) of Article 77(2) and point (c) of Article 79(2), in conjunction with Article 218(3) and (4) thereof,

Having regard to the recommendation from the European Commission,

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#### Whereas:

- (1) Negotiations should be opened with a view to concluding an agreement with Bosnia and Herzegovina on actions carried out by the European Border and Coast Guard Agency in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina.
- (2) This Decision constitutes a development of the provisions of the Schengen *acquis* in which the United Kingdom does not take part, in accordance with Council Decision 2000/365/EC<sup>1</sup>; the United Kingdom is therefore not taking part in the adoption of this Decision and is not bound by it or subject to its application.
- (3) This Decision constitutes a development of the provisions of the Schengen *acquis* in which Ireland does not take part, in accordance with Council Decision 2002/192/EC<sup>2</sup>; Ireland is therefore not taking part in the adoption of this Decision and is not bound by it or subject to its application.

(4) In accordance with Articles 1 and 2 of Protocol No 22 on the position of Denmark, annexed to the Treaty on European Union and to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, Denmark is not taking part in the adoption of this Decision and is not bound by it or subject to its application,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

### Article 1

- 1. The Commission is hereby authorised to open negotiations, in accordance with Article 54(4) of Regulation (EU) 2016/1624 of the European Parliament and of the Council<sup>1</sup>, with Bosnia and Herzegovina for an agreement on actions carried out by the European Border and Coast Guard Agency in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina.
- 2. The negotiations shall be conducted on the basis of the negotiating directives of the Council set out in the Addendum<sup>+</sup> to this Decision.

## Article 2

The negotiations shall be conducted in consultation with the Council Working Party on Frontiers. The Commission shall inform the European External Action Service as to the progress of the negotiations, for which the European External Action Service shall provide support and advice, as appropriate. The Commission shall be assisted by a representative of the European Border and Coast Guard Agency, acting as technical expert.
