Subject: Report on the implementation of Article 102A of the Convention Implementing the Schengen Agreement during the year 2012

---

1. Regulation (EC) No 1160/2005 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 6 July 2005 amended the Convention Implementing the Schengen Agreement of 14 June 1985 on the gradual abolition of checks at the common borders as regards access to the Schengen Information System to the services in the Member States responsible for issuing registration certificates for vehicles<sup>1</sup>.
2. Pursuant to this Regulation, a new Article 102A was added to the Convention Implementing the Schengen Agreement (CISA).

3. Article 102A(4) CISA provides that each year, after seeking the opinion of the joint supervisory authority set up pursuant to Article 115 CISA on the data protection rules, the Council is to submit a report to the European Parliament on the implementation of Article 102A.
4. The report should include information and statistics on the use made of the provisions of Article 102A and the results obtained in their implementation, and is to state how data protection rules have been applied.
5. At its meeting on 31 October 2013 the Working Party for Schengen Matters (SIS/SIRENE) agreed to the draft report on the implementation of Article 102A CISA during the year 2012.
6. **COREPER is therefore invited to approve the report on the implementation of Article 102A of the Convention Implementing the Schengen Agreement during the year 2012, as set out in document 11911/2/13 REV 2 SIRIS 70 SCHENGEN 27 ENFOPOL 218 COMIX 426 + COR 1, and request the Council to submit it to the European Parliament.**
