Subject: Draft COMMISSION DIRECTIVE ../.../EU of XXX amending Directive 2007/59/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards general professional knowledge and medical and licence requirements  
– Decision not to oppose the adoption (regulatory procedure with scrutiny)

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1. The Commission has submitted the above draft Directive to the Council for scrutiny in accordance with the procedure in Article 5a(3)(a) of Council Decision 1999/468/EC<sup>1</sup>. The Commission having presented the draft measure on 21 February 2014, the Council has until 22 May 2014 to decide to oppose the adoption.
2. Delegations were asked to examine the draft measure by 28 March 2014 and did not provide any indication that there are grounds for the Council to oppose its adoption.<sup>2</sup>

<sup>2</sup> Article 5a(3)(b) provides that the Council may, acting by qualified majority, oppose the adoption of such measures on the grounds that they exceed the implementing powers provided for in the basic instrument, are not compatible with the aim or the content of the basic instrument or do not respect the principles of subsidiarity or proportionality.

3. It is therefore suggested that Coreper recommend that the Council confirm that there are no grounds for opposing the draft measure. This implies that, unless the European Parliament opposes it, the Commission may adopt the proposed revised measure in accordance with Article 5a(3)(d) of Council Decision 1999/468/EC.
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
