Remarks at the gala evening in celebration of the 10th anniversary of the integration of the Slovak Republic to the European Union

Dobrý večer! Good evening! I am truly honoured to be here with you for this festive evening.

Tonight, we celebrate a journey, that of your country, and ten truly transformative years. We celebrate ten years, but we also celebrate and remember a moment. The moment Slovakia became a member of the European Union.

It seems so self-evident today – to the people of all fellow EU nations, and to all the people of Slovakia too I trust. That we are one Union, one big family of twenty-eight nations – rich in our diversity, strong in the ties and the values that unite us. That together, we are more prosperous, we have more clout in the world. And that our countries are there for each other, that your and our solidarity is strong. Belonging to the Union means the past is definitely behind you. It means freedom is there for good.

It has been ten years tonight, and for me, it is moving to celebrate this anniversary in Slovakia. Your country's journey to joining the Union was harder than most, the nineties were not an easy decade. But there was motivation, and there was determination, and then when the time came: there was success.
