Subject :	Adoption of a Recommendation from the Commission to the Council to authorise the Commission to negotiate guaranteed prices applicable in the delivery periods from 1 July 2008 to 30 June 2009 and from 1 July 2009 to 30 September 2009 to cane sugar originating in the ACP States referred to in Protocol 3 of Annex V to the ACP-EC Partnership Agreement and in India - Decision authorising the Commission to negotiate the appropriate agreements

- On 2 April 2008, the <u>Commission</u> presented a Recommendation to <u>Council</u> regarding the opening of negotiations with the ACP producer States and with India on the guaranteed prices applicable to cane sugar in the delivery periods from 1 July 2008 to 30 June 2009 and from 1 July 2009 to 30 September 2009.
- 2. Following examination of the Recommendation by the <u>Special Committee on Agriculture</u> at its meeting on 7 April 2008, the Committee agreed to suggest to Council that it take the following decision as an "A" item on the provisional agenda of a forthcoming meeting¹:

"The Council, on the recommendation of the Commission, has authorised the Commission to negotiate for the delivery periods from 1 July 2008 to 30 June 2009 and from 1 July 2009 to 30 September 2009 guaranteed prices applicable to cane sugar originating in the ACP States or India as respectively provided for in Protocol 3 of Annex V to the ACP-EC Partnership Agreement and in the Agreement between European Economic Community and the Republic of India on cane sugar.

The Commission shall conduct the negotiations in consultation with a special committee appointed by the Council and in accordance with the directives contained in Annex."

ANNEX

NEGOTIATING DIRECTIVES

- The Commission is hereby authorised to negotiate for the delivery periods from 1 July 2008 to 30 June 2009 and from 1 July 2009 to 30 September 2009 guaranteed prices applicable to cane sugar originating in the ACP States or India as respectively provided for in Protocol 3 of Annex V to the ACP-EC Partnership Agreement and in the Agreement between European Economic Community and the Republic of India on cane sugar.
- 2. The guaranteed prices shall refer to sugar of standard quality as defined in Community legislation, unpacked, cif European ports of the Community.
- 3. The guaranteed prices must be negotiated in such a way that:
 - the guaranteed prices for white and raw cane sugar applicable from 1 July 2008 to 30 September 2008 are not higher than the reference prices fixed for the marketing year 2007/2008 by Article 3 of Council Regulation (EC) No 318/2006;

and,

- the guaranteed prices for white and raw cane sugar applicable from 1 October 2008 to 30 September 2009 are not higher than the reference prices fixed for the marketing year 2008/2009 by Article 3 of Council Regulation (EC) No 318/2006.
- 4. The Commission shall inform the Council of the result of the negotiations and, where appropriate, of any problems encountered during those negotiations.
