Independent Review of the Implementation of the Development Agenda Recommendations, CDIP/11/8

Chairman,

The EU and its Member States would like to thank the African Group and Development Agenda Group for their joint proposal on terms of reference and methodology for the independent review of the implementation of the Development Agenda recommendations.

We note that the Director General has provided several reports on the implementation of the development agenda recommendations, and concluded that the Secretariat has "continued in a progressive manner and in accordance with the collective decisions of the Member States". We would also note that independent evaluations have been carried out in respect of a great number of development projects. This leads us to conclude that any independent review need not be onerous, and the terms of reference should enable an efficient and pragmatic consideration.

We would therefore question whether it is strictly necessary to consider the methodology of the evaluations undertaken in respect of various Development Agenda projects, or the basis of using projects at all.

We would also highlight that an assessment of the impact of the Development Agenda be confined to the relevant WIPO bodies.

We stand ready to hear the views of other delegations and discuss this issue further. Thank you

WIPO General Assembly decision on CDIP related matters, CDIP/12/5

Chairman,

The EU and its Member States take note of the WIPO General Assembly decision on CDIP related matters.

The CDIP has made great progress in implementing the Development Agenda recommendations, as has been highlighted several times by the Director General. By definition the core objective of the CDIP is to discuss IP and development. We consider it has been successful in this and in this regard fully delivered on its mandate. Therefore we see no purpose in adding an item on the agenda with the precise same objective and which would only repeat the title of the Committee. Having said that, we would like to emphasize that we are always open to discuss specific agenda items related to individual issues in respect of Intellectual Property and Development.

With regard to the Coordination Mechanism, much time has been spent by the CDIP and other bodies discussing the implementation of this mechanism. We note that different interpretations exist as to the meaning of the term "relevant WIPO bodies", and reiterate our position that the WIPO bodies should themselves determine whether they are relevant for the purpose of the Coordination Mechanism. We would note that protracted discussions on this topic would take time away from more concrete and meaningful discussion of CDIP projects.

In this sense these elements should be taken into account for future projects.

Implementation proposal on possible new WIPO activities related to using copyright to promote access to information and creative content, CDIP/12/9

Chairman,

The EU and its Member States would like to thank the Secretariat for document 12/9, which contains implementation plans for six activities related to using copyright to promote access to information and creative content.

With regard activities 1 and 2, WIPO would seem to be required to create, collect and hold a substantial volume of information, and enable the public, both professional and non-professional, to obtain easy access. It is not clear how the implementation of these activities and the application of open licences to protected works would affect the rights of copyright holders. It is further unclear whether the project would be held on a voluntary basis for MS, or what the next steps might be. We would need some further assurance in this regard before being able to endorse activities 1 and 2.

Concerning activities 3 and 4, they could be further considered by WIPO as a means to enhance awareness and understanding of open source software through a balanced and objective treatment of its advantages and disadvantages, including consequences of the use of open source software in relation to security issues and maintenance. With regard to activities 5-6, we note that further considerations on the exact scope of activities and their budgetary implications must be undertaken

Pilot project on Intellectual property and tourism (proposal from Egypt)

Mr. Chair,

EU and its member states thanks the delegation of Egypt for their proposal. After the first reading, we note that the proposal would seem to be interesting and possibly adding value to the competitiveness and further development of countries involved in the project.

However, we note that further information regarding the exact scope of the project, participating countries, budgetary implications and other aspects should be provided before the project can be discussed fully in the committee.

Furthermore, the EU and it's member states reiterates that submission of new projects should obey deadlines. Since the project was not introduced at the late stage, we look forward to discuss it at the next meeting of the CDIP.
