Subject: Commission delegated Regulation (EU) No .../.. of 30.7.2014 laying down information and publicity measures for the public and information measures for beneficiaries pursuant to Regulation (EU) No 514/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council laying down general provisions on the Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund and on the instrument for financial support for police cooperation, preventing and combating crime, and crisis management
- Intention not to raise objection to a delegated act

1. The Commission has submitted the above delegated act¹ to the Council in accordance with the procedure set out in Article 290 TFEU and with Article 53(4) of Regulation (EU) No 514/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council laying down general provisions on the Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund and on the instrument for financial support for police cooperation, preventing and combating crime, and crisis management². The Commission having notified the delegated act on 4 August 2014, the Council may object to it until 4 October 2014.

2. The Justice and Home Affairs Counsellors have examined the delegated act at their meeting on 5 September 2014 and agreed that there are no grounds for the Council to object to it.
 3. It is therefore suggested that Coreper recommend that the Council confirm that it has no intention to object to the delegated act and that the Commission and the European Parliament are to be informed thereof. This implies that, unless the European Parliament objects to it, the delegated act shall be published and enter into force in accordance with Article 58 of Regulation (EU) No 514/2014.
