Germany's national Eurojust member, Ms Annette Böringer, senior public prosecutor at the Federal Court of Justice, will return to the Federal Prosecutor General at the Federal Court of Justice on 1 September 2014. I am pleased to inform you that as the successor to Ms Böringer, Mr Klaus Jörg Meyer-Cabri, a Director at the Ministry of Justice and Consumer Protection, is very familiar with the day-to-day practice of cross-border cooperation.
