Proposal for a Council Regulation laying down detailed rules for the application of Article 108 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union

COM(2014) 534 final of 26.8.2014 - 2014/0246 (NLE)

Having regard to the Inter-institutional Agreement of 20 December 1994 on an accelerated working method for official codification of legislative texts, and in particular to point 4 thereof, the Consultative Working Party consisting of the respective legal services of the European Parliament, the Council and the Commission met on 25 September 2014 for the purpose of examining, among others, the aforementioned proposal submitted by the Commission.

At that meeting¹, an examination of the proposal for a Council Regulation codifying Council Regulation (EC) No 659/1999 of 22 March 1999 laying down detailed rules for the application of Article 108 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union resulted in the Consultative Working Party's establishing, by common accord, that in the introductory wording of Article 33 of the draft codified text the words "laid down in Article 35" should be adapted so as to read " laid down in Article 34".

In consequence, examination of the proposal has enabled the Consultative Working Party to conclude, without dissent, that the proposal is a straightforward codification of existing texts, without any change in their substance.
