Proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on protection against injurious pricing of vessels

COM(2014) 605 final of 29.9.2014 - 2014/0280 (COD)

Having regard to the Inter-institutional Agreement of 20 December 1994 on an accelerated working method for official codification of legislative texts, and in particular to point 4 thereof, the Consultative Working Party consisting of the respective legal services of the European Parliament, the Council and the Commission met on 14 October and 13 November 2014 for the purpose of examining, among others, the aforementioned proposal submitted by the Commission.

At those meetings¹, an examination of the proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council codifying Council Regulation (EC) No 385/96 of 29 January 1996 on protection against injurious pricing of vessels resulted in the Consultative Working Party's concluding, without dissent, that the proposal is a straightforward codification of existing texts, without any change in their substance.
