"Proposal for a Council letter to the authorities of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela on the continuation of fishing activities in the exclusive economic zone off the coast of French Guiana, following the judgement of the Court in cases C-103 and 165/12

Following the judgement of 26 November 2014 of the Court of Justice in cases C-103/12 and C-165/12 (European Parliament and the Commission vs. Council), whereby the Court annulled the Council Decision 2012/19/EU of 16 December 2011 on the approval, on behalf of the European Union, of the Declaration on the granting of fishing opportunities in EU waters to fishing vessels flying the flag of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela in the exclusive economic zone off the coast of French Guiana, with the effects of the Council Decision maintained, until the entry into force, within a reasonable period of time after the date of the judgement, of a new Decision to be adopted on an appropriate legal basis (Article 43(2) and 218(6)(a)(v) TFEU), it is proposed that the Council would send a letter (or a Note Verbale) to the authorities of Venezuela to inform them of the situation.

The Commission has strong legal objections against the Council's intention to contact the Venezuelan authorities, by means of a letter or a Note Verbale, as, under Article 17(1) TEU it is for the Commission to ensure the Union's external representation in areas outside the common foreign and security policy.

As the proposed letter constitutes an act of external representation of the Union in the area of the external common fisheries policy, the Commission reserves its right to contact directly the Venezuelan authorities."

The Committee took note of the EEAS summary note on the main outcomes of the Council meeting (Foreign Affairs/Development) on 12 December 2014.

#### 28. Follow-up to the Council meeting (Foreign Affairs) on 15 December 2014

The Committee was informed by the EEAS Secretary-General of the informal meeting with Ministers of Foreign Affairs and the HR, on 14 December 2014, during which they discussed working methods in the context of the Council (Foreign Affairs). The Committee was also informed of Ministers' discussions during the Council (Foreign Affairs) meeting on 15 December 2014, on Syria/Iraq/ISIL, Western Balkans and Bosnia-Herzegovina, Ukraine, and Ebola, as well as the discussion during lunch on Libya, in the presence of UNSG Special Representative Bernardino León.

#### Presentation of the agenda of the Council meeting (Foreign Affairs) on 19 January 2015 29.

The Committee was informed by the EEAS Secretary-General of the draft agenda of the Council (Foreign Affairs) on 19 January 2015, which would include discussions on Russia, climate change and (possibly) Libya. He took note of the Committee's wish to prepare the discussion on Russia prior to the Council (Foreign Affairs) meeting on 19 January 2015.

#### Follow-up to the Council meeting (General Affairs) on 16 December 2014 **30.**

The Committee took note of the main outcomes of the December GAC, notably:

- the adoption of the conclusions on the Enlargement and Stabilisation and Association process;
- the adoption of the conclusions on the Rule of Law;
- the Commission's presentation on the Annual Growth Survey;
- the Presidency' report on the Friends of Presidency group improving the functioning of the EU.

Over lunch Ministers examined the draft EC conclusions, discussed the Mid-term Review of the Europe 2020 Strategy, the Commission's 2015 Work Programme as well as the strengthening of the annual and the multiannual interinstitutional programming. Under AOB, Ministers discussed progress on the Digital Agenda.

<u>The Committee</u> took note of the follow-up the Council intends to give to the orientations of the December EC, notably as regards the imminent Commission proposal on European Fund for Strategic Investment (EFSI) and on Ukraine.

## 32. Presentation of the agenda of the Council meeting (Economic and Financial Affairs) on 27 January 2015

The Committee agreed the provisional agenda for this Council meeting.

It was requested that MIF (interchange fees for card-based payment transactions) be added to the ECOFIN agenda.

# 33. Proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Regulation (EC) No 223/2009 on European statistics (European Parliament second reading)

Analysis of the final compromise with a view to agreement 16509/1/14 REV 1 STATIS 132 ECOFIN 1161 CODEC 2434

With a view to reaching an early second reading agreement with the European Parliament, the Committee approved with a qualified majority the result of the negotiation with the colegislator as set out in the annex to document 16509/1/14 REV1. The NL and PT delegations indicated their intention to abstain at the adoption of the legal act, while the AT delegation intended to vote against.

The <u>UK delegation</u>, supported by the <u>DK, FI, HU and LT delegations</u>, added the following statement to the minutes:

"With reference to the proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Regulation (EC) No 223/2009 on European Statistics, the United Kingdom considers that, while Article 338(1) TFEU is the legal basis for Regulation 223/2009, it does not constitute an appropriate legal basis for Article 12.3(b) of the proposed Regulation. The latter Article provides for a competence of the European Commission to initiate and conduct an investigation where sectoral legislation provides for fines in cases where Member States misrepresent statistical data. The United Kingdom underlines that Article 338 TFEU does not provide for the imposition of fines or other sanctions in the field of statistics in sectoral legislation, therefore Article 12.3(b) is not considered as a legally permissible basis for future sectoral legislation."

# 34. Recommendation for a Council Regulation amending Regulation (EC) No 2533/98 concerning the collection of statistical information by the European Central Bank

- Political agreement

16514/2/14 REV 2 STATIS 133 UEM 396 ECOFIN 1162

<u>The Committee</u> exchanged views on the compromise text set out in 16514/2/14 REV 2. <u>A number of delegations</u> expressed concern on the wording of Article 12 paragraph 3(b). <u>The Committee</u> decided to postpone a final decision to a forthcoming meeting.

The SI delegation entered the following statement:

"Slovenia generally supports the proposal aiming at minimising the reporting burden on reporting agents and to enable proper performance of supervision of financial institutions, markets and infrastructures conferred on all competent authorities as well as a proper performance of the tasks conferred on authorities responsible for the protection of the stability of the financial system.

However, it has to be noted, that the proposal is not clear regarding the transmission of confidential statistical information as defined in proposed paragraph 4a in Article 8. Paragraph 4a stands as a legal basis for the transmission of confidential statistical information from the ESCB to authorities or bodies of the Member States and the Union responsible for the supervision of financial institutions, markets and infrastructure or the stability of the financial system, and to the European Stability Mechanism (ESM). Moreover, paragraph 4a stands also a legal basis for further transmission of confidential statistical information from the ESM to national parliaments to the extent required under national law.

To be explicit, according to national rules governing the statistical confidentiality, confidential statistical information are to be used solely for statistical purposes, meaning the exclusive use for the development and production of statistical results and analyses, and prohibition of its use for non-statistical purposes (i.e. administrative, tax, judicial, inspection,...). National rules are in line with the Regulation (EC) No 223/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 11 March 2009 on European Statistics. National central bank forms, besides their particular sphere of competences, a part of the national statistical system, and is therefore obliged to confirm with the rules on statistical confidentiality. In our opinion, proposed paragraph 4a represents a "grey field" for the transmission of confidential statistical information. Although the proposed Regulation should not apply to confidential statistical information collected according to Regulation 223/2009 on European statistics, there should be a clear division between using confidential statistical information according to the Regulation 2533/98 and in the sphere of the competences of the ESCB and authorities responsible for financial supervision, and using confidential statistical information in accordance with the Regulation (EC) No 223/2009 and national statistical legislation.

To conclude, we are of the opinion that the proposal is not clear enough in the limitation of using confidential statistical information and it could contributes to lower standards of statistical confidentiality."

## The AT, DE and FI delegations entered the following statement:

"Germany, Austria, Finland are subject to national constitutional provisions requiring swift and comprehensive submission of information regarding ESM activities to their national parliaments. In this context it is to be understood that the provisions regarding submission of information between ESM members and their respective parliaments as stated in Article 8, paragraph 4a, subparagraph 4 are without prejudice to constitutional obligations to transmit information without any delay."

- **Information from the Presidency on**

The Committee took note of the political agreements reached on the Regulation on interchange fees for card-based payment transactions and the Anti-Money Laundering package.

- **Eurocontrol reform** Eurocontrol's 42nd Provisional Council (PC), 4 and 5 December 2014
  - European Union coordination of a common position

In response to the unilateral statements of some Member States, as set out in 16338/14 ADD 3, the Commission presented the following statement:

"The Commission considers that the 2 December 2014 COREPER-level agreement on a common position, based on the information note submitted, constitutes a follow-up of an already developed common position approved at the level of COREPER on 29 November 2013, regarding the future of Eurocontrol. The 2013 information note represents the point of departure for concerted Union action in the matter.

The Commission would like to recall that the duty of sincere cooperation set out in Article 4(3) TEU compels Member States to refrain from taking any position in Eurocontrol on the substance of the issues raised that could undermine the attainment of the Union's objectives, including the further development of an EU position on the matter. Should any Member State act in a manner contrary to this understanding, the Commission reserves itself the right to have recourse to all means available under the Treaty."
