## I. INTRODUCTION

At its meeting in June 2014, the <u>European Council</u> established a "Strategic agenda for the Union in times of change" with "**Towards an Energy Union with a forward-looking climate policy**" (hereafter "Energy Union") as one of its five building blocks, to steer policy priorities during the new EU policy cycle.<sup>1</sup> This thematic priority is to focus on <u>affordable energy</u> for companies and citizens, <u>secure energy</u> for all countries, and <u>green energy</u>. The <u>Commission President's political guidelines</u> of July 2014 spelled out main priorities for Commission action in this area.

As a follow-up to the European Council, the <u>Council</u> (General Affairs) held thematic debates on Strategic Agenda priorities, including a debate on Energy Union on 18 November 2014, on the basis of a Presidency note setting out the state of play on some of the main orientations relevant to the Energy Union.<sup>2</sup>

In its conclusions of 18 December 2014, the European Council called on the Commission to present a comprehensive Energy Union proposal well ahead of the March 2015 European Council. The Commission adopted its Communication "A Framework Strategy for a Resilient Energy Union with a Forward-Looking Climate Change Policy " on 25 February 2015, together with a Communication on "The Paris Protocol – A blueprint for tackling global climate change beyond 2020" (in view of the Conference of the Parties to the UNFCCC (COP 21)) and a Communication on "Achieving the 10% electricity interconnection target, Making Europe's electricity grid fit for 2020".<sup>3</sup>

As a major contribution to ongoing reflections on the development of the Energy Union, the <u>Presidency</u>, in cooperation with the <u>Commission</u>, organised a <u>high-level Conference in Riga</u> on 6 February 2015, which launched the "Riga Process" of establishment of the Energy Union, by providing a platform for a broad dialogue of stakeholders and including discussions at ministerial level and with stakeholders on the five dimensions of the Energy Union (supply security, based on solidarity and trust; a competitive and completed internal energy market; greater energy efficiency; decarbonisation of the EU energy mix; research and innovation).

## II. <u>QUESTIONS FOR THE EXCHANGE OF VIEWS</u>

Building on these discussions, and in order to deepen the reflection on the shaping of the Energy Union, also with a view to the March 2015 European Council meeting, the <u>Presidency</u> suggests to focus on the following <u>questions</u> for the <u>exchange of views</u>: <sup>4</sup>

- 1. What do you see as the main lines of action to further develop and advance the concept of Energy Union?
- 2. Which aspects of sustainability, competitiveness and security of supply should be addressed more urgently as part of the development of the Energy Union, and how?
- 3. In which dimensions of the Energy Union do you see a potential for a regional cooperation?
