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### LAW ENFORCEMENT WORKING PARTY MIXED COMMITTEE

#### 1. Adoption of the agenda

The meeting adopted the agenda as set out in CM 2105/15.

#### 2. Information from the Chair of Telecommunications and Information Society Working Party regarding the opinion of the LEWP on PPDR Radio Spectrum Resources (700 MHz band)

7201/15 TELECOM 71 ENFOPOL 63 AUDIO 5

The LEWP took note of the information by the Chair of the Telecommunications and Information Society Working Party on the outcome of discussions by this Working Party on the opinion of the LEWP on PPDR Radio Spectrum Resources (see 7201/15). Following the intervention by two delegations on the need to take this opinion into account in the preparation for the World Radio Conference 2015 (WRC15), the Chair of the LEWP invited the Chair of the TELECOM Working Party to pass this message to his Working Party at its upcoming meeting, and at the same time encouraged delegations to coordinate their position at national level in order to ensure the smooth preparation of the WRC15.

## **LAW ENFORCEMENT WORKING PARTY**

### **1. Adoption of the agenda**

The meeting adopted the agenda as set out in CM 2105/15.

### **2. Information from the Presidency**

The Presidency briefed delegations about the recent and upcoming Presidency events. In particular, the Chair referred to the European Firearms Experts' (EFE) meeting of 14-15 April 2015 in Helsinki, where the Glossary of Firearms Terminology was discussed, and where experts were invited to submit their written comments on this Glossary by 15 May 2015. The LEWP was also informed about the ongoing trilogue process on the draft Europol and CEPOL Regulations.

### **3. Outcome of the CEPOL – Latvian Presidency conference on cybercrime, held on 25-27 March 2015 in Jurmala (LV)**

The LEWP took note of the outcome of CEPOL – Latvian Presidency conference on cybercrime as set out in 7368/15, presented by the LV expert. Suggestions were made on the follow up to the recommendations and conclusions agreed by the participants of that conference, in particular regarding the use of financing opportunities under the EU Framework Programme for Research and Innovation (Horizon 2020).

### **4. Overview of expert groups and networks related to the LEWP and the provisional planning of their meetings**

The meeting took note of the presentation by the Chair of the overview of the planned meetings of expert groups and networks related to the LEWP (7706/15), which will continue to be regularly updated.

## **5. Report on the CARPOL meeting held on 19-20 March 2015 in Riga (LV)**

The LEWP took note of the report on the CARPOL meeting, held on 19-20 March 2015 in Riga, Latvia, as set out in 7369/15, presented by the LV expert. A suggestion was made on updating the SIRENE manual in relation to stolen vehicles. The SK delegation informed the meeting that under its incoming Presidency a handbook in relation to combatting vehicle crime could be prepared, and that delegations would be invited to provide their contributions to a questionnaire in this regard.

## **6. Proposal for a Joint Police Operation (JPO) LUXCAR**

7641/15 ENFOPOL 75 ENFOCUSTOM 24 TRANS 119

The LEWP approved the proposal by the incoming LU Presidency to organise a Joint Police Operation (JPO) LUXCAR as set out in 7641/15. The link of this JPO to SOCTA was also mentioned and the calendar of the planned activities was outlined. The NL and LT delegations confirmed their participation in the JPO.

## **7. Discussion on the draft Council Conclusions concerning the introduction of mandatory standardised marking of construction machinery and agricultural and forestry vehicles in order to better protect them against theft**

5729/1/15 REV 1 ENFOPOL 27

The LEWP agreed to the draft Council Conclusions with the UK scrutiny reservation. A representative of the Commission pointed out to the need to limit the scope of these draft Council Conclusions taking into account Regulation (EU) No 167/2013. The Chair explained that the Commission's comments have been taken into account in the revised version of the document (5729/1/15 REV 1). The meeting was informed that the draft Council Conclusions would be submitted to Coreper and the Council for adoption, subject to the lifting of the UK scrutiny reservation.

## **8. Pilot project “Vigila et protege” on searching and protecting unaccompanied foreign minors**

The IT delegation made a detailed presentation of the pilot project “Vigila et protege” on searching and protecting unaccompanied foreign minors, with proposals for common rules in relation to the age limits and mandatory identification methods. A representative of the Commission intervened in support of this project, which was carried out with the financial contribution of the EU, and outlined the envisaged way forward in relation to the possible SIS II AFIS. Pending its implementation, Member States were encouraged to use the existing law enforcement information exchange channels, for example on the basis of the Swedish Framework Decision. The IT delegation invited delegations to comment on the presentation before considering further steps in relation to this project.
