In accordance with Article 26(2), last sentence, of the Council Decision of 28 February 2002 setting up Eurojust, as last amended by Council Decision 2009/426/JHA of 16 December 2008, I am pleased to inform you that Eurojust envisages instituting, by the end of June 2015, formal negotiations to conclude a working arrangement with the European Agency for the operational management of large-scale IT systems in the area of freedom, security and justice (eu-LISA).

This follows the decision taken on 17 March 2014 by the College of Eurojust to initiate formal negotiations with eu-LISA in light of the common interest of both organisations to establish and maintain cooperative relations, taking into account Article 26(1) of the revised Eurojust Decision.

We look forward to receiving the conclusions the Council may deem appropriate in this respect.
