<u>Blue Week – 3-6 June 2015</u>

The Blue Week event took place last June (3-6) and included the 3rd edition of the World Ocean Summit organized by the *Economist Events*, a *Blue Business Forum*, a major international business meeting of the maritime economy (fair, conferences, workshops, B2B) and a ministerial meeting organized by the Portuguese Government.

This ministerial meeting was attended by more than 70 delegations from all over the world. A declaration was approved by unanimity by the participating delegations. This declaration reinforces the concept of blue economy and its financing needs and considers maritime spatial planning and management as a relevant tool to foster sustainable development of the ocean. Throughout 26 paragraphs this declaration emphasizes that blue economy needs an innovative, integrated, ecosystem-based and multidimensional approach that takes into account not only the conventional uses of the oceans, but also emerging technologies and uses. Decoupling socio-economic development from environmental degradation, following an approach founded upon the assessment and incorporation of the true value of natural capital into all aspects of economic activity is a challenge that these delegations (countries and international organizations, such as EU, FAO, OECD, UN, UNEP) acknowledged as a relevant issue to be tackled. Finally, it was recognized that ocean governance and maritime policies demand more dialogue, coordination and integration of sectorial policies at all levels.
