Subject:	Recommendation for a COUNCIL DECISION authorising the Commission to open negotiations on behalf of the European Union for the renewal of the Protocol setting out the fishing opportunities and the financial contribution provided for by the Fisheries Partnership Agreement between the European Union and the Gabonese Republic  - Adoption

- 1. The <u>European Commission</u> submitted the above recommendation<sup>1</sup> on 7 August 2015 to the Council. The Council also received, on 11 September 2015, an assessment of the retrospective and forward looking evaluation of the Protocol to the Fisheries Partnership Agreement between the European Union and the Republic of Gabon<sup>2</sup>. The current Protocol will expire on 23 July 2016.
- 2. <u>The Working Party on External Fisheries Policy</u> examined the recommendation on 17 September 2015. The <u>Commission representative</u> underlined that:
  - the current Protocol was of central importance to the EU tuna fleet;

- the current annual reference tonnage of 20 000 tonnes was close to full utilisation by the French and Spanish fleets;
- the assessment concluded in favour of a renewal of the Protocol.

The <u>Commission services</u> would like to open the negotiations at the end of October 2015.

- 3. <u>DK</u> and <u>NL</u> entered parliamentary scrutiny reserves. The delegations whose fleets were using the protocol (<u>ES, FR</u>) stressed the importance of this protocol in the chain of bilateral tuna agreements.
- 4. The <u>Working Party</u> reached an agreement on the text on the basis of a draft Council Decision including negotiating directives<sup>3</sup>. The <u>Commission representative</u> reiterated that the explicit mention of a "surplus" in the context of stocks straddling various jurisdictions was not strictly necessary and recalled that the Commission did not agree to mention a substantial legal basis (Article 43 TFEU) in the mandate. It would again make a statement to that effect.
- 5. Consequently, <u>COREPER</u> is invited to confirm the agreement reached at the level of the Working Party and to suggest that the <u>Council</u>, at a forthcoming session:
  - adopts the Decision on opening negotiations and the accompanying negotiating directives as set out in doc. 12160/15 PECHE 305;
  - decides not to publish the Decision in accordance with Article 17(2)(b) of its Rules of Procedure;
  - notes that the European Parliament will be informed in accordance with Article 218(10)
     TFEU, and therefore a paper copy of the Decision including the negotiating directives will be transmitted to the Parliament;
  - enters the statement in the Addendum to this note in the minutes of the Council.
