= intention not to raise objections to a delegated act

1. The Commission submitted the above-mentioned delegated act to the Council in accordance with the procedure set out in Article 290 TFEU and with Article 13(1) of Regulation (EU) No 1093/2010¹, Regulation (EU) No 1094/2010² and Regulation (EU) No 1095/2010³.

2. The Commission notified this delegated act on 21 August 2015, indicating that an objection period of one month applied.
 3. On 18 September 2015 the Council decided to extend the period for raising objections by one month. The Commission and the European Parliament were informed thereof.
 4. During the silence procedure expired on 2 October 2015 only one delegation raised an objection, concerning an error (in Article 4, first paragraph), for which the Commission services have already informally anticipated a corrigendum procedure.
 5. It is therefore suggested that Coreper recommend that the Council confirm that it has no intention to object to the delegated act and that the Commission and the European Parliament are to be informed thereof. This implies that, unless the European Parliament objects to it, the delegated act shall be published and enter into force in accordance with Article 13(1) of Regulation (EU) No 1093/2010, Regulation (EU) No 1094/2010 and Regulation (EU) No 1095/2010.
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
