TRANSFER OF APPROPRIATIONS N° DEC 45/2013

INTRODUCTION

The so-called "End of Year Transfer" is intended to ensure that, insofar as possible, the outstanding requests for additional payments related to funds in shared management, can be met, by making full use of any available payment appropriations, right up to mid-December.

The rules governing this facility are set out in Article 179(2) and 179(3) of the Regulation (EU, EURATOM) No 966/2012 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the financial rules applicable to the general budget of the European Union¹.

The "End of Year Transfer" for the 2013 exercise relates to payment appropriations amounting to **EUR 139.8 million** in total, which takes account of the actual implementation of expenditure in mid-December 2013. The amount to be transferred represents 0.1% of the total payment appropriations authorised in the 2013 budget. This amount is drawn from 52 budget lines, of which 36 concern amounts of EUR 1 million or less. This compares with an "End of Year Transfer" for 2012 of EUR 290.9 million, drawn from 102 lines. The detailed justifications for the adjustments to each budget line are set out in the annexe. Shorter, standard justifications may be used for amounts representing less than 10% of the authorised appropriations on the budget line, or amounts less than EUR 1 million.

The transfers for **reduction** concern the following headings:

Heading 1a:	Competitiveness	EUR	85.0 million

 Heading 3b: 	Citizenship	EUR	1.2 million

The reinforcement addresses part of the outstanding needs on three budget lines:

- + EUR 28.9 million for 04 02 19 European Social Fund (ESF) Regional Competitiveness and employment;
- + EUR 106.0 million for 13 04 02 Cohesion Fund:
- + EUR 4.9 million for 18 02 06 External Borders Fund.

This transfer will ensure the best use of authorised appropriations, and will contribute to meeting outstanding commitments, and reimbursing Member States for payments already undertaken in shared management.

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Justifications

Decrease 02 04 04 02

Completion of the sixth Community framework programme (2003 to 2006)

In 2013 a minor amount was foreseen on this budget line for the Completion of the Sixth Framework Programme for Research (2003-2006) to allow payment of final corrections on the on-going audit files. However, for two on-going files, the closure procedure will not be finalised in 2013. Therefore, the final payments for these two files will be postponed to 2014, and EUR 0.1 million may be transferred.

Increase 04 02 19

European Social Fund (ESF) - Regional Competitiveness and employment

Pending payment applications sent by Member States are ready to be paid but cannot be paid due to the lack of payment appropriations. The proposed reinforcement of EUR 28.9 million will reduce the amount of applications from 2013 which will have to be paid from Budget 2014.

Decrease 04 03 03 03

Information, consultation and participation of representatives of undertakings

The lower than expected implementation of payment appropriations is mainly a temporary effect of the modification of financial rules which has resulted in some delays for a number of calls for proposals. The new Financial Regulation led to the need to revise and update the calls for proposals, including preparing new templates, announcements, rules of the call, etc. This not only required more preparation time in comparison to previous years, but also led to more requests for clarifications from the side of the potential beneficiaries. As a consequence, a significant amount of pre-financing payments, initially planned for 2013, will only be paid in 2014. This allows for the redeployment of EUR 2.5 million.

Decrease 04 03 04

EURES (European Employment Services)

As in the case of item 04 03 03 03, the lower than expected implementation of payment appropriations is mainly a temporary effect of the modification of financial rules, which has resulted in some delays for a number of calls for proposals, and also to issues related to the eligibility of costs claimed. In addition, for EURES, there was a significant change from a single-beneficiary to a multi-beneficiary call. As a consequence, a significant amount of pre-financing payments, initially planned for 2013, will only be paid in 2014. This allows for the redeployment of EUR 3.7 million.

Decrease 04 04 01 01

Employment

As in the above mentioned cases, the lower than expected implementation of payment appropriations is mainly a temporary effect of the modification of financial rules, which has resulted in some delays for a number of calls for proposals. As a consequence, a significant amount of pre-financing payments, initially planned for 2013, will only be paid in 2014. This allows for the redeployment of EUR 3.6 million.

Decrease 04 04 01 02

Social protection and inclusion

As in the above mentioned cases, the lower than expected implementation of payment appropriations is mainly a temporary effect of the modification of financial rules, which has resulted in some delays for a number of calls for proposals. As a consequence, a significant amount of pre-financing payments, initially planned for 2013, will only be paid in 2014. This allows for the redeployment of EUR 3.1 million.

Decrease 04 04 01 03

Working conditions

As in the above mentioned cases, the lower than expected implementation of payment appropriations is mainly a temporary effect of the modification of financial rules, which has resulted in some delays for a number of calls for proposals. As a consequence, a significant amount of pre-financing payments, initially planned for 2013, will only be paid in 2014. This allows for the redeployment of EUR 1.1 million.

Decrease 04 05 01

European Globalisation Adjustment Fund (EGF)

The assessment of some of the applications in the pipeline has taken more time than initially expected; with the need to see further information and clarification from applicant Member States. This has left a backlog of cases that can only be proposed for approval in 2014, and EUR 8.8 million can be transferred.

Decrease 05 02 10 02

Promotion measures - Direct payments by the Union

Several factors lead to lower than expected costs in 2013: the cost for the high level visits is lower than foreseen, amounts submitted in final invoices will be also lower than foreseen; and finally, the exchange rates for these actions were more favourable than originally expected. An amount of EUR 63 000 can therefore be transferred.

Decrease 05 05 02

Instrument for Pre-accession Assistance for Rural Development (IPARD)

After the reimbursement of the last declaration of expenditure of the year, no new payments are to be made before the end of 2013. Therefore, the existing balance of EUR 0.5 million can be made available.

Decrease 05 08 01

Farm Accountancy Data Network (FADN)

The advance payment for one Member State's 2013 accounting year farm returns was less than initially forecast. In addition, a number of the outstanding 2012 accounting year farm returns were not paid as originally planned. The result is an available amount of EUR 0.1 million.

Decrease 05 08 03

Restructuring of systems for agricultural surveys

The amount of expected payments in 2013 will not be as high as originally forecast in the 2013 Budget, allowing for a transfer of EUR 58 000.

Decrease 07 02 01

Contribution to multilateral and international environment and climate agreements

There is a balance of EUR 61 421 in payment appropriations remaining on this line after all the contributions to multilateral and international environment and climate agreements have been paid. This balance can made available for other needs.

Decrease 07 02 04

Preparatory action - Environmental monitoring of the Black Sea Basin and a common European framework programme for development of the Black Sea region

In 2013 the payment appropriations on this budget line were used to cover a final payment for this preparatory action, which was for a lower amount than foreseen. Therefore, the remaining balance of EUR 29 699 can be made available.

Decrease 07 12 01

Implementation of Union policy and legislation on climate action

A second call for proposals aiming to sign operating grants with NGOs working in the field of environment and climate action was launched with the aim initially for the grant agreements to be signed in December 2013. However, a delay is now expected. Pre-financing payments (60%) are due upon signature of the agreements, which will now only take place in 2014, and so the amount destined to cover those payments (EUR 1.8 million) can therefore be released.

Decrease 11 03 01

International fisheries agreements

A payment for additional catches (linked to the agreement with Gabon) was lower than initially forecast, and EUR 30 274 may be transferred.

Decrease 11 03 03

Preparatory work for new international fisheries organisations and other non-compulsory contributions to international organisations

The payments related to the projects included in the revision of the work programme at the end of November 2013 will not be made in 2013 and will be postponed to 2014, allowing for the transfer of EUR 0.2 million.

Decrease 11 04 01

Closer dialogue with the fishing industry and those affected by the common fisheries policy

Requirements for information and communication expenses are lower than initially forecast due to a number of actions either being delayed or cancelled, or having a lower cost than initially budgeted. As for the financing of regional advisory councils, final payments have been lower than originally planned. The combined effect of these elements, is that a transfer of EUR 0.6 million can be made from this article.

Decrease 11 09 06

Preparatory action - Guardians of the Sea

Following the call for proposals, the evaluation of offers is ongoing. The final selection of the beneficiary and the first payment will not take place before 2014, and so EUR 0.2 million can be redeployed.

Decrease 12 04 01

Specific activities in the field of financial services, financial reporting and auditing

The available payment appropriations (EUR 1 million) have arisen from a correction of eligible amounts following a check carried out on beneficiaries of the grant programme.

Increase 13 04 02

Cohesion Fund

Pending payment applications sent by Member States are ready to be paid but cannot be paid due to the lack of payment appropriations. The proposed reinforcement of EUR 106.0 million will reduce the amount of applications from 2013 which will have to be paid from Budget 2014.

Decrease 13 05 02

Instrument for Pre-Accession Assistance (IPA) - Regional development component

The volume of claims received means that there is an amount remaining on the line (EUR 23.5 million) which can be transferred in the End of Year Transfer to enable the payment of pending claims under the Structural Funds.

Decrease 13 05 03 02

Cross-border cooperation (CBC) and participation of candidate and potential candidate countries in Structural Funds' transnational and interregional cooperation programmes - Contribution from Heading 4

The volume of claims received means that there is an amount remaining on the line (EUR 15.4 million) which can be transferred in the End of Year Transfer to enable the payment of pending claims under the Structural Funds.

Decrease 14 03 03

Membership of international organisations in the field of customs and tax

This budget line covers membership to international organisations in the field of tax and customs. The largest amount represents membership to the World Customs Organisation (WCO), which is indexed yearly. The indexation for 2013 has been lower than foreseen. Therefore, the remaining EUR 11 770 in payment appropriations can be made available.

Decrease 14 03 04

Good governance in the area of tax

This budget line was created in 2010 on an initiative from the European Parliament to support good tax governance. Since 2012 the payment appropriations on this line have only been needed to cover the finalisation of projects. The vast majority of projects have now been finalised and paid, and thus the remaining amount of EUR 0.2 million can be made available for transfer.

Decrease 17 02 02

Union action in the field of consumer policy

Due to delays in the 2013 commitments and the signature of contracts, as well as to the cancellation of some planned actions, EUR 1.1 million in payment appropriations will not be consumed and, therefore, can be returned.

Decrease 17 02 03

Preparatory action - Monitoring measures in the field of consumer policy

As the interim report for the preparatory action has been sent later than expected, it will not be possible to approve it and make the payment before 31 December 2013, and on this basis, EUR 0.2 million may be transferred.

Decrease 17 03 09

Pilot project - Complex research on Health, Environment, Transport and Climate Change (HETC) - Improvement of indoor and outdoor air quality

As the quality of the final report submitted was not of a sufficient standard, the final payment has been postponed, pending the necessary revision, and so an amount of EUR 0.7 million may be transferred.

Increase 18 02 06

External Borders Fund

Due to the implementation profile of this programme, payment appropriations were used during 2013 as a source of temporary redeployment. This was a short-term measure aiming at avoiding obligations to pay late interest. It is now both necessary, and possible to reinforce the Fund, which is in shared management, by EUR 4.9 million.

Decrease 18 05 08

Prevention, preparedness and consequence management of terrorism

The Prevention, preparedness and consequence management of terrorism (CIPS) programme had to deal with a shortage of payment appropriations during the year, until such time as the reserve related to Schengen Governance was lifted. To counteract this difficulty, the line was temporarily reinforced from other sources, including the External Borders Fund (DEC 11/2013), until the transfer lifting the reserve (DEC 20/2013) was adopted at the end of September. In total, the line was reinforced by almost EUR 6 million during the year, nearly doubling the voted budget, and most of this reinforcement has been implemented. However, at the year-end, taking account of the pressing needs of the External Borders Fund, as well as the probable final implementation, it is proposed to transfer EUR 1.4 million.

Decrease 18 05 09

Prevention of and fight against crime

The Prevention of and Fight against Crime (ISEC) programme had to deal with a shortage of payment appropriations during the year, until such time as the reserve related to Schengen Governance was lifted. To counteract this difficulty, the line was temporarily reinforced from other sources, including the External Borders Fund (DEC 11/2013), until the transfer lifting the reserve (DEC 20/2013) was adopted at the end of September. In total, the line was reinforced by more than EUR 42 million during the year, almost all of which has been implemented. However, at the year-end, taking account of the pressing needs of the External Borders Fund, as well as the probable final implementation, it is proposed to transfer EUR 3.5 million.

Decrease 22 02 02

Transition and institution-building assistance to potential candidate countries

A Delegation Agreement "the Rural Credit Guarantee Fund" with Kreditanstalt für Wiederaufbau (KfW) under the 2012 National Programme for Albania for EUR 5 million has still not been finalised. Therefore a payment of EUR 4 million originally foreseen for December 2013 will be delayed until the first quarter of 2014. Other works contractors in Albania have also experienced liquidity problems which have led to a slow-down in effected works and requests for interim payments. In total EUR 5 million in payment appropriations can therefore be made available.

Decrease 32 04 14 01

Energy projects to aid economic recovery - Energy networks

The payments for eight projects, which were planned for end-2013, will now be made in 2014, as the project beneficiaries have not yet submitted the related payment requests. In parallel, the payments on another three projects have been advanced to 2013. Overall, this leaves a net result of EUR 48.6 million remaining for redeployment.

Decrease 32 04 14 03

Energy projects to aid economic recovery - European offshore wind grid system

The release of EUR 4.8 million in payment appropriations from this budget line is related to the payment requests of the beneficiaries for three projects. For two of the projects for which a payment was foreseen in 2013 the beneficiaries are now in the process of updating their cost claims. As a result the corresponding payments could not be implemented by the end of 2013. For the third project, following supplementary information received by the beneficiary, the actual costs to be covered accounted for less than the initial forecast
