The Presidency presented its progress report and reaffirmed its commitment to reach a Council position by the April 2016 JHA Council and an agreement with the European Parliament by June 2016. The Presidency thanked delegations for the agreement reached on 24 February 2016 in Coreper on the coast guard related texts (EBCG, EMSA and EFCA), on Chapter I and on Chapter II, part 2, of the EBCG text.

The Presidency is actively engaging with the European Parliament.

3. Migration: follow-up of European Council Conclusions 18-19 February 2016
= **Exchange of views**

Ministers held an exchange of views on the current migratory situation, including the monitoring of the implementation of the conclusions of the European Council and of measures already agreed by the Council at their recent meetings. Ministers examined in particular possible measures that need to be taken to reduce the possible negative humanitarian consequences of measures being adopted to strengthen border controls.

Ministers also took note of ongoing developments and possible next steps in the process leading to the possible use of Article 26 of the Schengen Borders Code, and requested to be kept fully informed and up-to-date on all relevant developments on this file.
