Subject:	Appointment of four members of the Management Board of the European Medicines Agency (EMA) - <i>Procedure</i>

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### A. INTRODUCTION

1. Article 65(1) of Regulation (EC) No 726/2004 of 31 March 2004 laying down Community procedures for the authorisation and supervision of medicinal products for human and veterinary use and establishing a European Medicines Agency provides that, in addition to one representative of each Member State, two representatives of the Commission and two representatives of the European Parliament, two representatives of patients' organisations, one representative of doctors' organisation and one representative of veterinarians' organisations shall be appointed as members of the EMA Management Board by the Council in consultation with the European Parliament on the basis of a list drawn up by the Commission. It further provides that the European Parliament may submit its views to the Council for consideration, which shall then appoint the members of the Management Board.

2. On 27 January 2016, the Commission adopted a Decision<sup>1</sup> setting out a list of candidates relating to the nomination of four members of the Management Board of the European Medicines Agency. The Commission sent the Decision to the Council and the European Parliament and also provided the curricula vitae of the candidates.
3. The Council Secretariat has sent a letter with an Annex containing the list of candidates together with the curricula vitae of the candidates directly to the Deputy Permanent Representatives and to the Health Attachés.
4. An official letter<sup>2</sup>, in which the European Parliament informs the Council of which of the candidates on the list it recommends is expected to be issued shortly. The letter will list one candidate representing doctors, one candidate representing veterinarians and two candidates in order of recommendation representing patients.
5. The Commission has proposed three candidates<sup>3</sup> for the post of Management Board member representing doctors. The European Parliament is expected to recommend one of them for appointment.
6. The Commission has proposed two candidates<sup>4</sup> for the post of Management Board member representing veterinarians. The European Parliament is expected to recommend one of them for appointment.
7. The Commission has proposed ten<sup>5</sup> candidates for the post of Management Board member representing patients. The European Parliament is expected to retain two of these candidates, in order of preference, for consideration by the Council.

## B. PROCEDURE

8. Under Article 16(3) of the Treaty on European Union<sup>6</sup>, a **qualified majority** is required for these appointments.
9. The Council must select one representative for doctors from three candidates, one representative for veterinaries from two candidates and two representatives for patients among ten candidates.
10. In order to establish a simple procedure for finding out which candidates have the strongest support, it is proposed to follow the procedure outlined in points 12 and 13<sup>7</sup>. A decision by the Permanent representatives Committee to use that procedure could, in accordance with Article 240(3) of the Treaty on the functioning of the European Union<sup>8</sup>, be adopted by a **simple majority** (at least fifteen votes) of its members.
11. After selecting the candidates to be appointed following the procedure in points 12 and 13, the Committee could verify that a qualified majority of its members (Article 238(2)<sup>9</sup> of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union<sup>10</sup>) could support a decision to recommend to the Council to appoint those candidates.

12. It is suggested that the procedure for the appointment of the representatives be as follows:
- the members of the Permanent Representatives Committee will be given an opportunity to express their views on the various candidates if they wish;
  - the Permanent Representatives Committee will vote by secret ballot, Member States' delegations each having one vote;
  - each Member State delegation is entitled to vote for two candidates representing patients, one candidate representing doctors and one candidate representing veterinarians. Delegations also have the option of abstaining from voting for any candidate;
  - candidates' names will appear in alphabetical order on each ballot paper;
  - if at the first count there is a simple majority (at least fifteen votes) in favour of:
    - = two<sup>11</sup> candidates representing patients, the Committee will recommend that the Council appoint these candidates;
    - = one candidate representing doctors, the Committee will recommend that the Council appoint this candidate;
    - = one candidate representing veterinarians, the Committee will recommend that the Council appoint this candidate;
  - if it is not possible to select two candidates representing patients, one candidate representing doctors and one candidate representing veterinarians based on the first count, further ballots will be held until two candidates for patients, one candidate for doctors and one candidate for veterinarians<sup>12</sup> have been selected pursuant to point 13.

13. In order to decide which candidates shall be retained for the next ballot or selected, the following rules apply:
- a) in each ballot (including the first one) the candidate receiving the lowest number of votes<sup>13</sup> shall be eliminated;
  - b) once all but two (for patients all but three) candidates have been eliminated, the candidate (for patients the two candidates) that received the highest number of votes shall be selected, even if that number of votes is lower than fifteen;
  - c) if, when all but two (for patients all but three) candidates have been eliminated the remaining candidates received an equal number of votes, the Chair shall choose one (for patients two) of them for appointment.

#### **C. TERM OF OFFICE**

14. In accordance with Article 65(4) of Regulation (EC) 726/2004 the term of office shall be three years. It is suggested that the Council leave it to the Management Board to set the date on which the term of office of the persons appointed will start.

#### **D. PUBLICATION OF THE COUNCIL DECISION**

15. It is suggested that the Council Decision making this appointment be published in the Official Journal of the European Union, as is normally the case regarding such appointments.

## Conclusion

**The Permanent Representatives Committee is invited to**

- **approve the arrangements described in points 12 and 13 above;**
- **in accordance with points 12 and 13, establish which of the candidates representing patients, doctors and veterinarians have the strongest support;**
- **verify that a qualified majority can agree to recommending to the Council to appoint to the posts as member of the Management Board of the EMA the candidates selected in accordance with points 12 and 13;**
- **agree that the starting date of the three-year term of office of the persons to be appointed as members of the Management Board of the EMA will be set by the Management Board;**

**and to**

- **invite the Council to decide at a forthcoming meeting:**
  - = **to appoint the persons thus recommended (a draft Decision for this purpose appears in Annex I hereto);**
  - = **to have the appointing Decision published in the Official Journal of the European Union.**
