14. EU Capacity Building Mission in Somalia (EUCAP Somalia) -extension - DecisionAdoption5685/185568/18

Statement by the Commission

"In light of the rules of the Treaties, a CFSP decision cannot be used as a means to confer power on the Council to enact a derogation from the procurement rules defined in the Financial Regulation given that such power is attributed to the Commission. Moreover, any derogation from the rules on participation in the procurement procedures for the EU Capacity Building Mission in Somalia (EUCAP Somalia) cannot be of generic and unlimited nature and must be duly justified in each specific case.

The Commission considers that the derogating provisions on procurement in the CFSP Decision can only be interpreted as a purely enabling clause. The Commission continues to exercise its competences in the implementation of the budget related to the Mission as stemming from the Treaties and in accordance with the rules and procedures of the Financial Regulation."

Confirmation of the final compromise text with a view to agreement

Statement by the Netherlands

"The Netherlands can support the final agreement on the Modernisation of Trade Defence Instruments (MTDI). However, the Netherlands remains very concerned about the newly created possibility to enforce trade defense measures to be applied on the continental shelf by the Customs Authorities.

The Netherlands wants to make sure that this element of the MTDI proposal will be implemented only when the Union legislation has been amended in such a way as to facilitate the levying and collecting of duties and the necessary changes have been made to the customs IT systems in order to allow these systems to perform this new task. These changes need to be effected as part of the broader IT developments of the Multi Annual Strategic Plan (MASP) and the Union Customs Code IT work program. These conditions will have to be met in the further deliberations on the implementing act in the relevant Council working parties before its adoption."

Statement by Cyprus

"Cyprus can support the final agreement on the Modernisation of Trade Defence Instruments (MTDI).

However, Cyprus would like to express concerns as to the risks involved in the implementation and the enforcement of Trade Defence instruments on the Continental Shelf by Customs Authorities.

It is considered that this element of the MTDI proposal will be implemented when the customs IT systems are properly amended in order to perform the new task for levying and collecting of duties."

Joint statement by Malta and Denmark

"We note that the outcome on the Trade Defence Instruments Modernisation dossier is overall balanced and acceptable. Whilst accepting this outcome, we are nevertheless expressing our concern with the inclusion of the possibility of applying duties on the continental shelf.

This element was not part of the Commission proposal or the original Council position. It is disproportionate to the problem it aims to address and risks becoming an unreasonable administrative burden for certain Member States, in the form of practical monitoring, surveillance, costs and enforcement by the Customs Authorities.

In view of the work on this element, we would like to stress the need for a mechanism that is the least burdensome possible, both from the perspective of administration as well as of costs and call on the Commission to provide clarity at the earliest. The Commission should also not submit a proposal for an implementing act until all Member States are satisfied that the new provisions will be manageable in practice."
