Statement by Denmark

"Denmark supports the proposal and the overall aim of empowering the national competition authorities. Effective competition rules are crucial for ensuring a well-functioning Single Market and growth as competition encourages innovation, efficiency and guarantees consumers the best choice.

However, Denmark finds that, as point of principle, the choice of applicable procedural law should remain a matter for the Member States, who can thereby ensure that proceedings are in line with their rules and legal traditions. Therefore, Denmark strongly regrets the wording of Article 12 of this Directive.

Although it does not change Denmark's position on this matter, Denmark welcomes the references in Article 12 and recital 29 of this Directive, to the general principles of EU law and the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union, in particular Articles 47 and 48. These references make it clear that those rules apply in all proceedings concerning infringements of Articles 101 and 102 TFEU, including non-criminal judicial proceedings."

Statement by France

"Lors du comité permanent du 1^{er} février 2018, la France a voté contre le projet de règlement modifiant l'annexe V du règlement (CE) n°999/2001 visant à alléger les mesures de retrait des matériels à risque spécifié (MRS)⁽¹⁾, considérant que cette modification entraîne une augmentation du risque relatif au prion pour les consommateurs.

La liste des MRS pour les petits ruminants doit tenir compte de l'infectiosité des tissus vis-à-vis de l'ensemble des maladies à prion, dont l'encéphalopathie spongiforme bovine (ESB) ainsi que la tremblante. Les avis de l'Agence nationale de sécurité sanitaire de l'alimentation, de l'environnement et du travail (Anses) du 20 mars 2017 et de l'EFSA de 2015 concluent que la possibilité de transmission à l'homme de la tremblante ne peut être ni confirmée ni exclue.

L'Anses précise, dans son avis du 20 mars 2017, que tout allègement de la liste des MRS pour les petits ruminants présenterait un risque potentiel accru en matière de santé publique en raison de l'augmentation du niveau d'exposition des consommateurs aux prions de petits ruminants.

La France estime ainsi que ce projet de règlement ne répond pas aux objectifs de l'article 7 du règlement 178/2002 sur la législation alimentaire relatif au principe de précaution.

La France considère que les matériels à risques spécifiés constituent le seul outil qui permet de limiter l'exposition du consommateur aux prions et que ce règlement engendre un potentiel risque accru pour les consommateurs. Elle souhaite que la liste des MRS soit révisée dès que de nouveaux éléments scientifiques probants seront disponibles.

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- (1) Le projet de règlement prévoit que la liste des MRS pour les petits ruminants soit réduite au crâne, y compris l'encéphale et les yeux, et à la moelle épinière des animaux âgés de plus de 12 mois ou qui présentent une incisive permanente ayant percé la gencive, ou des animaux dont l'âge est estimé à plus de 12 mois au moyen d'une méthode approuvée par l'autorité compétente de l'État membre d'abattage. En effet, tel qu'indiqué au considérant 12 du projet de règlement, l'estimation de l'âge des ovins et des caprins sur la base de la dentition ne constitue qu'une approximation."
