

Information from the Presidency and the Commission Exchange of views

<u>The Council</u> took note of the information provided by the Presidency and the Commission on the progress made, including the written summaries presented in 6659/18.

During the exchange of views, <u>Ministers</u> estimated that considerable progress had been made on the implementation of the 2016 Council conclusions. They provided information on measures taken at national level (for example, national legislation, programmes and awareness-raising campaigns) and praised the work carried out by the Commission on the EU Platform on Food Losses and Food Waste.

However, the majority of Ministers urged to speed up the implementation in order to reach the ambitious target 12.3 set out in the UN 2030 Agenda. In their view, further action was needed in particular on measurement methodology, definitions and data, labelling, awareness raising, new technologies, research and innovation, incentives, marketing standards, exchange of best practices, using former food as feed and food donation.

Reduction of food losses and food waste is a priority for <u>several Ministers</u>. Some of them stressed that national action should remain the key for achieving progress. <u>Ministers</u> underlined that reduction of food losses and food waste is a cross-sectoral issue, having a strong link with circular economy and a certain environmental, economic and social dimension. Problems are complex, concern the entire food chain and require action and cooperation of all stakeholders.

<u>Some Ministers</u> underlined that agriculture plays a major role in combating food losses and food waste and they were of the view that the new programming period and the future CAP reform could present an opportunity to enhance prevention of food losses and food waste.

### STATEMENT BY THE NETHERLANDS

"The Netherlands can support the final agreement on the Modernisation of Trade Defence Instruments (MTDI). However, the Netherlands remains very concerned about the newly created possibility to enforce trade defense measures to be applied on the continental shelf by the Customs Authorities.

The Netherlands wants to make sure that this element of the MTDI proposal will be implemented only when the Union legislation has been amended in such a way as to facilitate the levying and collecting of duties and the necessary changes have been made to the customs IT systems in order to allow these systems to perform this new task. These changes need to be effected as part of the broader IT developments of the Multi Annual Strategic Plan (MASP) and the Union Customs Code IT work program. These conditions will have to be met in the further deliberations on the implementing act in the relevant Council working parties before its adoption."

### JOINT STATEMENT BY MALTA AND DENMARK

"We note that the outcome on the Trade Defence Instruments Modernisation dossier is overall balanced and acceptable. Whilst accepting this outcome, we are nevertheless expressing our concern with the inclusion of the possibility of applying duties on the continental shelf.

This element was not part of the Commission proposal or the original Council position. It is disproportionate to the problem it aims to address and risks becoming an unreasonable administrative burden for certain Member States, in the form of practical monitoring, surveillance, costs and enforcement by the Customs Authorities.

In view of the work on this element, we would like to stress the need for a mechanism that is the least burdensome possible, both from the perspective of administration as well as of costs and call on the Commission to provide clarity at the earliest. The Commission should also not submit a proposal for an implementing act until all Member States are satisfied that the new provisions will be manageable in practice."

#### STATEMENT BY SWEDEN

"The proposal for a **Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council amending**Council Regulation (EC) No 1225/2009 will contribute to an increased level of trade protection, and thus harm the competitiveness of the EU industry."
