#### Ad "B" item 3: Reform of the Electoral Act Approval

### STATEMENT BY PORTUGAL

"Portugal states that its favourable vote presupposes that the threshold established by Article 3 is not required to apply to Portugal because, under the current distribution of seats, it has fewer than 35 seats in the European Parliament. However, if the distribution of seats in the European Parliament is changed, the Constitution of the Portuguese Republic would not allow the application of a threshold, such as that laid down by Article 3, that would limit the conversion of votes into seats by means of a minimum percentage."
