### **COUNCIL DECISION**

to authorise the Commission to negotiate an Agreement between the Government of the United States of America and the European Union on the coordination of energy-efficiency labelling programmes for office equipment

### THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, and in particular Article 218(3) and (4) thereof,

Having regard to the recommendation from the European Commission,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

## Article 1

- (1) The Commission is hereby authorised to negotiate on behalf of the European Union a new agreement between the Government of the United States of America and the European Union on the coordination of energy-efficiency labelling programs for office equipment.
- (2) The Commission shall conduct those negotiations on behalf of the Union, and shall negotiate the provisions of the Agreement in accordance with the Negotiating Directives set out in the Addendum to this Decision.
- (3) The negotiations shall be conducted in consultation with the Council Energy Working Party, designated by the Council as the special committee in accordance with Article 218(4) TfEU. The Commission shall report regularly to the special committee, including, where possible, in writing.
- (4) The Council may review the content of the Negotiating Directives at any time.

#### Annex to ANNEX I

# Directives for the negotiation of an Agreement between the Government of the United States of America and the European Union on the coordination of energy-efficiency labelling programmes for office equipment

- The Commission shall ensure that the negotiated draft Agreement contains the main provisions of the Agreement currently in force<sup>1</sup>, including the possibility for manufacturers to self-certify their products in the EU.
- 2. In light of the above and given the decision of the US to introduce third-party certification to the programme in the US, the Commission shall ensure that the provisions of the negotiated draft Agreement related to product registration, notably those listed under Article VI of the Agreement currently in force are adapted accordingly.
