#### **d) Detailed grounds for the transfer**

According to article 9 of the Multiannual Financial Framework the Emergency Aid Reserve (EAR) is intended to allow for a rapid response to specific aid requirements of third countries following events which could not be foreseen when the budget was established; first and foremost for humanitarian operations, but also for civil crisis management and protection, and situations of particular pressure resulting from migratory flows at the Union's external borders, where circumstances so require.

#### **d) Detailed grounds for the transfer**

With 13,1 million people in need of humanitarian assistance, including 7,7 million people suffering from severe food insecurity and over 5 million people displaced, the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) represents one of the world's biggest humanitarian emergencies.

An Ebola outbreak was declared by the authorities on 8 May 2018. While assessments and initial medical response are ongoing, the World Health Organisation estimates that the outbreak is of high severity. The Congolese Ministry of Health presented a first response plan for the outbreak requiring USD 11,9 million.

In addition, due to the escalating violence, the displacement of populations continues to intensify. The displacements lead to increasing food insecurity, with historically high levels of hunger and malnutrition. Given the continuing political tensions, a further increase in the humanitarian needs can be expected in the coming months.

As this deterioration of the situation could not be foreseen at the time of initial humanitarian aid planning, an additional EUR 25 million in commitment and payment appropriations is requested (in addition to the EUR 25,3 million already allocated).

This additional funding will ensure the deployment of relevant surge capacity to the Ebola affected areas, surveillance and contact tracing of victims, as well as measures for early detection of those infected. It will also cover information activities for the affected communities on risks and necessary prevention, as well as support to the health structures. Immediate food assistance will also be provided for the upcoming lean season from August 2018 until early 2019.

As of 23 May, the overall implementation rate of commitment appropriations of the humanitarian aid chapter 23 02 was at 89,2%, while for payment appropriations it was at 40,4%. The remaining balance of EUR 57 million in the Operational Reserve, after taking into account commitments currently being processed, needs to be preserved to cover urgent crises until the end of the year. An equal reinforcement in commitment and payment appropriations is needed since it is expected that the payment appropriations currently available in the budget will be fully used for the currently planned actions.

The Commission has also considered, but could not identify availabilities from other policy areas in Heading 4. It therefore requests the mobilisation of the Emergency Aid Reserve in the amount of EUR 25 million in commitment and payment appropriations.
