d) Detailed grounds for the transfer

According to article 9 of the Multiannual Financial Framework the Emergency Aid Reserve (EAR) is intended to allow for a rapid response to specific aid requirements of third countries following events which could not be foreseen when the budget was established; first and foremost for humanitarian operations, but also for civil crisis management and protection, and situations of particular pressure resulting from migratory flows at the Union's external borders, where circumstances so require.

d) Detailed grounds for the transfer

Three countries in the Lake Chad basin - Chad, Cameroon and Nigeria - have, in recent months, experienced additional displacements of people due to on-going conflicts. Coupled with the effects of the drought and the up-coming hungry season, these countries require urgent additional humanitarian assistance.

In Chad, around 30 000 refugees fleeing violence in Central African Republic (CAR) have arrived in Southern Chad since December 2017. Furthermore, due to Boko Haram violence and military operations, there are around 100 000 internally displaced people around the Lake Chad. The lean season is expected to begin three months earlier this year and almost 1 million people will be in need of urgent food assistance.

In Cameroon, the Far North Region is facing a humanitarian crisis due to the spill-over effect of the conflict in Northeast Nigeria. The attacks along the border over the past few months have led to a significant increase in population movement. Furthermore, internal displacement continues in the Far North of Cameroon. With the on-going dry season, water and sanitation notably remain a serious concern.

In Nigeria, additional 100 000 people have been displaced since the beginning of 2018 due to the ongoing conflict. Food insecurity continues to be at dramatic levels. Over 3,7 million people are in need of humanitarian assistance and this figure will increase to 5,3 million people during the lean season.

In total, EUR 30 million in commitment and payment appropriations in addition to the EUR 77,8 million already allocated for the three countries in 2018 are needed mainly to:

- provide aid to newly displaced and refugees and to their host communities;
- provide aid such as food assistance and life-saving nutrition during the period of hunger.

As of 23 May, the overall implementation rate of commitment appropriations of the humanitarian aid chapter 23 02 was at 89,2%, while for payment appropriations it was at 40,4%. The remaining balance of EUR 57 million in the Operational Reserve, after taking into account commitments currently being processed, needs to be preserved to cover urgent crises until the end of the year. An equal reinforcement in commitment and payment appropriations is needed since it is expected that the payment appropriations currently available in the budget will be fully used for the currently planned actions.

The Commission has also considered, but could not identify availabilities from other policy areas in Heading 4. It therefore requests the mobilisation of the Emergency Aid Reserve in the amount of EUR 30 million in commitment and payment appropriations.
