### Statement by Belgium

"The proposal based on Article 223 TFEU put forward on 11 November 2015 by the European Parliament for a Council Decision adopting the provisions amending the Act concerning the election of the members of the European Parliament by direct universal suffrage (the 'Electoral Act'), has been discussed at length in the Council. Establishing an obligatory minimum threshold has been the last outstanding issue before reaching consensus among Member States.

Along with several other delegations, Belgium has consistently argued in favour of a facultative threshold since this would uphold the prospect of preserving political – as well as cultural and linguistic diversity, cfr. Art. 3 TEU - diversity within the European Parliament. It would also ensure trust in our citizens by protecting their ability to vote for smaller parties who would have a greater chance of gaining European political representation, and have the voice of the citizens they represent heard within Parliament.

Belgium is not in the capacity to pronounce itself on the compromise proposal with regard to the obligatory threshold. Therefore Belgium will abstain and not object the consensus."

# Statement by Portugal

"Portugal declares that its favorable vote is based on the presupposition that the threshold established by article 3 does not apply to Portugal because it has less than 35 seats in the European Parliament, according to the current allocation. However, if the distribution of seats in the European Parliament is changed, the Constitution of the Portuguese Republic would not allow the application of a threshold such as that foreseen in article 3, inasmuch as it would limit the conversion of votes into seats by establishing a minimum percentage."

## Statement by Croatia

"Croatia is giving its consent to the opening of the accession negotiations with Serbia in Chapter 13 (Fisheries).

At the same time, Croatia would like to reiterate that this should not in any way be construed as Croatia's acquiescence to any current practices in the area of fresh water fisheries by Serbia where the border between the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia has not been finally determined.

The Screening Report on Chapter 13 notes that Serbia claims to have 31 fishing districts, some of which extend over the Danube River. The current practices of Serbia's fishermen, both professional and recreational, do not respect the formal republican border as existent in 1991 which as of date of independence of the Republic of Croatia in 1991 has become the international boundary protected by international law. Accordingly, Croatia reserves the right to financial compensation for exploitation of its fish stocks.

The right bank of the Danube River is currently under the control of the Croatian border police, while the left bank is under the control of the Serbian authorities, although large areas of the Republic of Croatia are found on the left bank of the Danube River, which had been the case in 1991, at the time of the dissolution of the former SFRY and the establishment of the new states. Only when the borderline between the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia is finally determined and both sides assume control of their respective territories on the other side of the Danube River, the issues as to the exact course of the state border will have been resolved.

Croatia would also like to reiterate its position that no document in the accession negotiations of Serbia with the EU can prejudge the final determination of the border between Croatia and Serbia. This includes all documents, maps, legal acts and positions (either written or orally submitted) presented or referred to by the Republic of Serbia in the EU accession negotiations. It also applies to all EU documents and positions in the EU accession negotiations with Serbia. This is an issue that Croatia will continue to follow closely in all relevant negotiation chapters throughout the negotiation process, notably in connection with Chapter 31, where Serbia has a clear obligation to make every effort to find mutually acceptable solutions to all pending bilateral issues, including on borders, with all neighbouring countries."

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#### Statements by the Commission

"The Commission regrets the exclusion of missions referred to in Articles 42(1), 43 and 44 TEU from the scope of the Regulation and notes that, as a result, there will be no data protection rules in place for such missions. The Commission notes that a Council decision, based on Article 39 TEU, could only lay down the data protection rules for processing of personal data by Member States when carrying out activities that fall within the scope of the Common Foreign and Security Policy. Such a Council decision could not include rules that apply to activities carried out by EU institutions, bodies, offices and agencies. In order to remedy the legal lacuna, a possible Council decision therefore would need to be accompanied by an additional, complementary instrument, based on Article 16 TFEU."

"The Commission notes that paragraph 3 of Article 9 (former Article 70a of the Council's General Approach) does not create a new obligation on Union institutions and bodies as regards the balance to be struck between personal data protection and public access to documents."
