THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, and in particular Article 292 thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) Commission Recommendation C(2006)5186 of 6 November 2006 established a Practical Handbook for Border Guards (Schengen Handbook) containing common guidelines, best practices and recommendations on border controls.
- (2) The Commission committed itself to ensuring regular updates of the Practical Handbook for Border Guards. It did so by Recommendations C(2008)2976, C(2009)7376, C(2010)5559, C(2011)3918, C(2012)9330 and C(2015) 3894 final.
- (3) The Schengen Handbook should incorporate two new appendices as required by the changes of Regulation (EU) 2016/399 of the European Parliament and of the Council¹ brought by Regulation (EU) No 2017/458 of the European Parliament and of the Council².
- (4) As referred to in Recital 12 of Regulation (EU) No 2017/458, a new appendix (Appendix A) should be added to the Schengen Handbook, laying out the notification procedure to be followed by Member States intending to carry out checks against relevant databases on a targeted basis regarding persons enjoying the right of free movement under Union law.
- (5) A second appendix (Appendix B) should be added to the Schengen Handbook to clarify the provisions of Article 8 of Regulation (EU) 2016/399 concerning temporary derogation to the systematic checks against relevant databases and in particular, aspects related to assessing the risk of carrying out checks on a targeted basis and to the follow-up of a notification of the intention to derogate.

- (6) Appendices A and B to the Practical Handbook for Border Guards have been developed by the Commission, in cooperation with the Member States and the European Border and Coast Guard Agency,

HEREBY RECOMMENDS:

1. The Appendices A and B, which are in the Annex to this Recommendation, should be added to Recommendation of 6 November 2006 (C(2006)5186 final).
2. Member States should transmit the amendments to the Practical Handbook for Border Guards, laid down in this Recommendation, to their national authorities competent for carrying out border controls on persons.
