In the document ST 14280/17 INIT:

1. page 5, point 3, second paragraph should read as follows:

" At the outset, a large majority of Member States were unable to accept the change in the age of the child by which the leave can be used. They consider that there is insufficient evidence as to how this change would contribute to achieving the aims set out in the Directive, **taking into account** the considerable impact on planning national budgets, as well as the large number of different national schemes already in place for supporting working parents, including day care facilities."

2. page 15, recital (19a) should read as follows:

**"(19a) This Directive should be without prejudice to the coordination of social security systems under Regulation 883/2004, Regulation (EU) No 1231/2010 and Regulation (EC) No 859/2003. The Member State competent for social security of a person is determined by application of those Regulations."**
