THE DRAFT COUNCIL RECOMMENDATION ON THE DISCHARGE TO BE GIVEN TO THE CONSUMERS, HEALTH AND FOOD EXECUTIVE AGENCY

The Council welcomes the Court's opinion that, in all material respects, the Executive Agency's annual accounts present fairly its financial position as at 31 December 2017 and the results of its operations, its cash flows, and the changes in net assets for the year then ended, in accordance with the provisions of the Executive Agency's Financial Regulation, and that the underlying transactions for 2017 are legal and regular in all material respects. Nevertheless, some observations need to be made.

The Council regrets the deficiencies found by the Court in the Executive Agency's accounting environment. The Council calls on the Executive Agency to take all necessary actions mainly to ensure the accounting officer's independence and the segregation of duties between the accounting officer and the authorising officer.

The Council, whilst taking note of the Executive Agency's reply, regrets the deficiencies found by the Court in the Executive Agency's procurement and staff recruitment procedures. It urges the Executive Agency to further improve its procurement and staff recruitment procedures in order to ensure the effectiveness and the regularity of the processes. It also calls on the Executive Agency to ensure the full implementation without unjustified delay of electronic public procurement.

The Council encourages the Executive Agency to ensure proper transparency and publicity of its vacancy notices, while avoiding unjustified costs.

The Council regrets that, again, a high level of commitment appropriations was carried over to 2018. While acknowledging the Court's changes in its reporting approach on carryovers, as well as the multiannual nature of operations, the Council urges the Executive Agency to continue improving its financial programming and monitoring of the budget implementation in order to reduce the unjustified level of commitments carried over and the amounts cancelled at the end of the following year to the strict minimum, in line with the budgetary principle of annuality.
