Policy debate



13548/17

The Council held a policy debate on the above topic on the basis of a discussion paper prepared by the Presidency (13548/17). The policy debate was launched by an external guest speaker Professor Howard Williamson (University of South Wales).

Ministers inter alia highlighted the necessity to hear the voices of young people when the new EU Youth Strategy is prepared, and in particular stressed the importance of reaching out to vulnerable young people and those that are difficult to reach. They also stressed migration and its effect on young people, the need for decent jobs and quality education, the mental health problems of young people, and safe use of internet and social media as well active participation with new platforms as possible topics that could be covered by the future EU Youth Strategy.

Policy debate

<u>The Council</u> held a policy debate on the above topic on the basis of a discussion paper prepared by the Presidency (13540/17). An introduction to the debate was given by <u>Mr Risto Mäeots</u>, the CEO of Magnetic MRO.

<u>Ministers</u> highlighted the importance of raising awareness among young people of the attractiveness of VET, as well as the importance of promoting lifelong learning and fostering the flexibility of education systems. The need to incorporate new methods and digital possibilities to VET was also raised.

<u>The Council</u> held a policy debate on the above topic on the basis of a discussion paper prepared by the Presidency (13149/17). The debate was preceded by an introductory speech given by Ms Helen Sildna, creative entrepreneur and social activist.

Ministers underlined the importance of culture as a driving force of European societies and European integration, which has to be matched with adequate financial resources. The need to cooperate and undertake specific cultural projects at both national and EU levels that could attract European citizens and thus create a sense of belonging was also mentioned. Many ministers also highlighted the opportunity that the upcoming European Year of Cultural Heritage represents in this regard.
