## PROCEDURAL ASPECTS OF THE CITIZENS' INITIATIVE "BAN GLYPHOSATE AND PROTECT PEOPLE AND THE ENVIRONMENT FROM TOXIC PESTICIDES"

In accordance with Article 4(2) of Regulation (EU) No 211/2011 the present initiative was registered on 25 January 2017 and published in the Commission's online register.

The members of the citizens' committee registered with the Commission are residents of the following Member States: France, Germany, Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Estonia and Spain.

The initiative was registered in English. Based on the translation service offered by the European Economic and Social Committee the organisers provided translations of the title, subject-matter, and objectives of the initiative in all official EU languages except Irish.

In accordance with the Regulation on the Citizens' Initiative, the forms used by citizens to give their support to the initiative contained the title, subject-matter and objectives of the initiative. The link to the Commission's online register was also available on the forms, allowing citizens who wished so to find more detailed information on the initiative, as provided by the organisers in an Annex as part of their registration request. This Annex may not have been consulted by all citizens who supported the initiative.

While the collection period for the initiative formally ran until 25 January 2018, its organisers decided to close the collection on 2 July 2017. After the verification of the collected statements of support by the relevant competent Member States' authorities, the organisers submitted their initiative to the Commission on 6 October 2017, together with certificates issued by 22 Member States' competent authorities and information on their sources of funding and support, in accordance with Article 9 of the Regulation.

In the weeks following the submission of the initiative, the organisers sent to the Commission certificates from six additional Member States' authorities:

- The Czech Republic: 9 901 valid statements of support
- Estonia: 588 valid statements of support
- Portugal: 7 990 valid statements of support.
- Romania: 1 681 valid statements of support
- Slovakia: 2 217 valid statements of support
- United Kingdom: 94 502 valid statements of support.

In accordance with Article 10 of the Regulation, the Commission:

- received the organisers on 23 October 2017.

During the meeting at the Commission, the Commission was represented by First Vice-President Timmermans, Commissioner Andriukaitis and senior officials from the various services concerned.

On 20 November 2017, in accordance with Article 11 of the Regulation, organisers were given the opportunity to present their initiative in a public hearing organised at the European Parliament. The Commission was represented by Commissioner Andriukaitis.
