The Mission of the Principality of Liechtenstein to the European Union presents its compliments to the General Secretariat of the Council of the European Union and has the honour to refer to the notification by the Council of 21 May 2019, which reads as follows:

„In accordance with the Protocol signed between the European Union, the European Community, the Swiss Confederation and the Principality of Liechtenstein on the accession of the Principality of Liechtenstein to the Agreement between the European Union, the European Community and the Swiss Confederation on the Swiss Confederation's association with the implementation, application and development of the Schengen acquis, and with the first sentence of Article 5(2)(a) of the Protocol, the Principality of Liechtenstein is herewith notified of the adoption of the following act:

Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on establishing a framework for interoperability between EU information systems in the field of borders and visa and amending Regulations (EC) No 767/2008, (EU) 2016/399, (EU) 2017/2226, (EU) 2018/1240, (EU) 2018/1726 and (EU) 2018/1861 of the European Parliament and of the Council and Council Decisions 2004/512/EC and 2008/633/JHA

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Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on establishing a framework for interoperability between EU information systems in the field of police and judicial cooperation, asylum and migration and amending Regulations (EU) 2018/1726, (EU) 2018/1862 and (EU) 2019/816

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Date of adoption: 14 May 2019"

In accordance with Article 5(2)(a) and (b) of the Schengen Protocol and subject to the fulfilment of the constitutional requirements in Liechtenstein, the Mission of the Principality of Liechtenstein to the European Union has the honour to inform the General Secretariat of the Council of the European Union that the Principality of Liechtenstein accepts the content

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of the acts, which was attached to the above mentioned notification by the Council and forms part of this reply note, and will implement it in its internal legal order.

In accordance with Article 5(2)(b) of the Protocol, the Principality of Liechtenstein will promptly notify the General Secretariat of the Council of the European Union upon fulfilment of the constitutional requirements.

This exchange of notes will enter into force on the date of the notification by the Principality of Liechtenstein of the fulfilment of its constitutional requirements.

The Mission of the Principality of Liechtenstein to the European Union avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the General Secretariat of the Council of the European Union the assurances of its highest considerations.



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
