Statement by Hungary

on the Council Recommendation on the 2019 National Reform Programme of Hungary and delivering a Council opinion on the 2019 Convergence Programme of Hungary

"The statements on the Hungarian judicial system are politically motivated, biased and do not reflect the reality as the relevant legislative environment has not changed in the reporting period. In addition, the text fails to establish the direct relevance of the highlighted issues for the objectives of the European Semester, thus undermining the credibility of the process.

Consequently the recommendations related to judicial independence and access to information are unjustified, unsubstantiated and therefore unacceptable. They cannot serve as the basis of a meaningful economic policy dialogue and are not conducive to genuine political ownership.

Such recommendations do not serve the purposes of the semester process and must be avoided in the future.

It is regrettable that the Finnish Presidency did not modify the text despite the clear explanation and suggestions of the Council Legal Service that was supported by the concerned Member State and regardless of the fact that no delegation raised objection to include those modifications. As a result, the Presidency, at its own discretion, submits a text to the Council which does not allow Hungary to support the adoption of its own recommendations given that is not in line with the content and legal constraints of the Semester."

Statements by the Commission

- Emergency situations

"Under Article 30 of the Delegated Regulation, the Commission is empowered to adopt interim measures only when an emergency situation has a severe direct impact on road safety, cyber security or the availability and integrity of C-ITS service. In short, it is about situations in which swift reaction is of the essence. Nevertheless, the Commission intends to consult Member States and the expert group referred to in Article 29(2) whenever materially possible, having regard to the degree of urgency. Furthermore, it follows from Article 30 that interim measures are strictly limited to containing the risks on road safety, cyber security and the availability and integrity of C-ITS services linked to the emergency situation observed. Such interim measures would not suspend or alter the application of any element of the Delegated Regulation that is not linked to the emergency situation. For example, should one of the cryptographic algorithms provided for in the Delegated Regulation be broken or hacked, an interim measure may provisionally forbid the use of this algorithm. Other algorithms or indeed other elements of the Delegated Regulation would not be affected.

All this is without prejudice to the preparations for a revision of the Delegated Regulation, to be commenced immediately following an emergency situation. Using the same example, these preparations could be aimed at the inclusion of alternative cryptographic algorithms and possibly other requirements to prevent similar emergency situations from occurring in the future."

- Fee-based revenue source for the Commission

"Annex III, section 9.1, points 371 and 373, suggests that root certification authorities pay fees to the "C-ITS certificate policy authority", the "trust list manager" and the "C-ITS point of contact". However, these passages are manifestly not drafted as legal basis for the imposition of fees by Union institutions or bodies. They must therefore not be misunderstood as covering the Commission acting in its capacity as holder of any of these three functions, i.e. during the period until dedicated entities will have been established. Instead, they are intended for future situations, should the Commission's role end and alternative solutions to ensure these central roles have been agreed upon. By the same token, they do not encroach upon future legislative acts.

The fact that fee financing of Commission activities is not intended is also confirmed by section 5 of the Explanatory Memorandum. That section clearly implies that the tasks allocated to the Commission during the period in question are to be funded by the Union budget, notably through the 'Security architecture for connected infrastructure and vehicles in Europe' support action in the context of Commission Implementing Decision C(2016) 1966."

- Technologies and Funding

"The Commission recalls its policy as set out in the 5G Action Plan, in particular its ambition to promote early deployment of 5G infrastructure along major transport paths and to support 5G testing and deployment. It stresses that 5G technologies will operate in co-existence with technologies already being deployed. The fact that the Regulation currently relies on a particular technology, the only one available today for the purposes in question, is entirely without prejudice to future developments.

Hence, future deployment and related EU funding of the kind will continue to work from the hybrid model approach, whereby ever more services can be provided by ever more technologies. The aim will be to develop a full and interoperable ecosystem that facilitates cooperative connected and automated mobility.

The Commission calls upon Member States and industry to use all EU funding instruments to progress on connected and automated mobility, including the Connecting Europe Facility funding in the Transport and Digital sectors which will continue to support the pre-deployment of innovative new ITS services and new technologies (e.g. 5G) or a combination of both in oncoming calls. The Commission also calls upon Member States and industry to test future mobility solutions and demonstrate the complementarity of different connectivity and automation technologies. The "living lab" under preparation by the Commission Joint Research Centre in ISPRA and the 5G corridors are available for this."

Statement by Poland, the Czech Republic, Slovakia and Lithuania

"Polska, Republika Czeska, Słowacja i Litwa popierają konieczność modernizacji Traktatu Karty Energetycznej w zgodzie ze współczesnymi standardami odzwierciedlonymi w zreformowanej strategii UE w zakresie ochrony inwestycji. Jesteśmy przekonani, że Traktat Karty Energetycznej powinien zawierać jasne odniesienia do zrównoważonego rozwoju, w tym celów w zakresie zmiany klimatu i przejścia na czystą energię zgodnie z Porozumieniem Paryskim, aby lepiej odzwierciedlać nowe realia sektora energii, w szczególności rosnącą potrzebę zacieśnienia regionalnej i globalnej współpracy na rzecz ochrony środowiska.

Zgodnie z przygotowanym przez Komisję uzasadnieniem niniejszej decyzji (COM(2019) 231 final) Polska, Republika Czeska, Słowacja i Litwa rozumieją że zmodernizowane postanowienia Traktatu Karty Energetycznej w zakresie zrównoważonego rozwoju i społecznej odpowiedzialności biznesu, jak wynika ze zreformowanej strategii UE w zakresie ochrony inwestycji, będą miały niewiążący charakter. Zatem wzywamy Komisję do przyjęcia tego samego podejścia i zwracania się do Państw Członkowskich po wytyczne w przedmiocie każdej propozycji tekstu przedłożonej w ramach procesu modernizacji Traktatu Karty Energetycznej."

Courtesy translation

"Poland, Czech Republic, Slovakia and Lithuania support the necessity of modernising the Energy Charter Treaty in line with the modern standards as reflected in the EU's reformed approach on investment protection. We also believe that the Energy Charter Treaty should contain sound references on sustainable development, including on climate change and clean energy transition in line with the Paris Agreement to better reflect the new realities of the energy sector, especially the growing need for enhanced regional and global cooperation on environmental protection.

In accordance with the Commission's explanatory memorandum (COM(2019) 231 final), Poland, Czech Republic, Slovakia and Lithuania understand that, as it stems from the EU reformed approach on the investment protection, the modernised provisions of the Energy Charter Treaty in the area of sustainable development and corporate social responsibility will have non-binding nature. Thus, we call upon the Commission to follow this approach and to seek guidance of the Member States on each and every text proposal submitted in the process of modernisation of the Energy Charter Treaty."
