Primary and secondary education at Colegio del Verbo Divino.

Graduated from Andrés Bello Diplomatic Academy in 1975.

Studied Economics at Fordham University in New York.

Obtained a B.A. in Economics from Fordham University in 1980.

Studied Political Science at City University of New York. Completed graduate program in 1982.

Did further graduate work in political science at Universidad Católica de Chile (1983) and the University of Maryland (1986).

Has held various positions at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, including Chief of Staff to the Director General of Political Affairs, Deputy Director of Environmental Affairs, Director of European Affairs, Director of South American Affairs, Director General of Consular and Immigration Affairs and, currently Secretary General of Foreign Policy.

Abroad, he has served in various positions at the Permanent Mission of Chile to the United Nations, the Embassy of Chile in Washington D.C., the Embassy of Chile in the former German Democratic Republic, the Embassy of Chile in Germany and at the Embassy of Chile in Japan.

As Ambassador, he has served in Malaysia and Brunei Darussalam (2004-2008) and in Japan (2010-2016).

He has taught Chilean Foreign Policy at the Andrés Bello Diplomatic School.
