Subject:	Council Decision requesting a Commission study on updating the existing legislation on plant reproductive material - Adoption

- (1) On 6 May 2013, the <u>Commission</u> submitted to the European Parliament and to the Council a proposal for a Regulation on the production and making available on the market of plant reproductive material¹, intended to consolidate and update the existing legislation which is currently fragmented in 12 Council Directives.
- (2) The Working Party on Agricultural Questions examined the proposal under the Irish, Lithuanian and Hellenic Presidencies.

- (3) On 11 March 2014, the <u>European Parliament</u> rejected the proposal and called on the Commission to withdraw it and submit a new one². In view of this development, the <u>Hellenic Presidency</u> referred the issue to the <u>Committee of Permanent Representatives (Part 1)</u>³, which agreed that further preparatory work should be conducted as a contribution to the debate on the architecture of a possible revised Commission proposal. On that basis, the <u>Council</u> held a discussion on 16 June 2014 and expressed general support for a Presidency report containing orientations for a possible revised Commission proposal⁴.
- (4) In December 2014, the President of the <u>Committee of Permanent Representatives (Part 1)</u> addressed a letter to the Commission, reiterating the Council's request for a revised proposal⁵. The <u>Commission</u> withdrew the proposal in its work programme for 2015⁶, and did not submit a new one.
- (5) In December 2017, the President of the <u>Committee of Permanent Representatives (Part 1)</u> addressed another letter to the Commission to seek clarity on the state of play and to ask the Commission to present the next steps envisaged⁷. The <u>Commission</u> replied in June 2018, indicating that the situation would need to be re-evaluated after the 2019 European Parliament elections⁸.
- (6) Following consultations with delegations, the <u>Presidency</u> tabled on 26 August 2019 a draft Council Decision based on Article 241 TFEU requesting the Commission to submit a study on the Union's options to consolidate and update the existing legislation on the production and marketing of plant reproductive material⁹. Under Article 241 TFEU, the Council acts by simple majority.
- (7) The Working Party of Agricultural Counsellors/Attaches ('the Working Party') discussed that draft at its meeting of 6 September 2019. Following an informal silence procedure, the Working Party agreed by simple majority on the text set out in document 11348/2/19 REV 2.

 - confirm, by simple majority, the agreement reached by the Working Party; and
 - recommend that the <u>Council:</u>
 - adopt, by simple majority, the draft Council Decision set out in document 12783/19
 (text finalised after legal-linguistic revision) as an "A" item on the agenda of one of
 its forthcoming sessions; and
 - decide to publish it in the EU Official Journal ("L" series) as soon as possible.
