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Statement by Greece

"Greece expresses its concerns regarding the reduction of payment appropriations in Heading 3 "Security & citizenship" mainly from the Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund (EUR 20,0 million) and the European Border and Coast Guard Agency (EUR 19,3 million).

As it is widely known Greece faces continuous and disproportionate migratory pressure. In 2019 the total number of migrants' and refugee's arrivals from Turkey to the EU was over 60.000, 58.000 of which arrived to Greece, meaning that 96% of the total arrivals from Turkey to the EU has been recorded in the Greek territory. Overall arrivals to Greece in 2019 (58.455) continued to rise, registering a 38% increase compared to the same period in 2018 (42.364). Arrivals by land in 2019 totaled at 11.038 and arrivals by sea 47.417.

September saw the highest monthly flows in the Eastern Mediterranean since the entry into force of the EU-Turkey declaration, mainly due to the nearly 11.000 arrivals on the Eastern Aegean islands. Following a sharp drop in numbers in April / May, the land route (Greek-Turkish land borders) again increased, recording about 1.100 monthly arrivals since August.

Both National Programmes of the Funds AMIF and ISF, are actively involved into addressing the challenges of the migration issue. This year alone, the M-S declared expenditures of mil.38,680 euro and mil.33,916 euro for AMIF and ISF respectively, having an overall absorption that exceeds 45%.

Finally, with regard to the reference concerning the few grant agreements for EMAS applications submitted by Greece as stated in the working doc. WK 156/2020, we would like to stress that the grant agreements of our country have been increased at the end of the year."

Joint Statement by Malta and Slovakia

"We acknowledge the efforts of the Presidency to reach a compromise with the European Parliament on the draft Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Regulation (EC) No 862/2007 of the European Parliament and of the Council on Community statistics on migration and international protection.

However, we cannot accept the compromise as stated in document 15244/1/19.

Our concerns on this draft regulation, as already expressed during several Council Working Parties on Statistics, and during the COREPER meetings of 20 November 2019 and 4 December 2019, and also through the silence procedure that was launched, have not been addressed. The lack of real and relevant justification for the additional data and their added value for policy making persists, and the double-reporting problem has not been adequately catered for but left unclear. Furthermore, the change to recital 11, wherein requesting the prioritization of the inclusion of data requirements in the legal architecture of the regulation, has exacerbated our problem on the process since this is enabling the circumvention of an appropriate impact assessment vis-à-vis their policy-needs and creating unsubstantiated high resource and administrative constraints for Member States."
