Subject:	Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) .../... of 8.6.2022 amending Regulation (EU) 2019/2144 of the European Parliament and of the Council to take into account technical progress and regulatory developments concerning amendments to Vehicle Regulations adopted in the context of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe - Intention not to raise objections

1. On 8 June 2022, the Commission submitted the above draft Delegated Regulation to the Council in accordance with Articles 4(3) and (6) of Regulation (EU) 2019/2144¹, which amends its Annexes I and II.

2. The draft Delegated Regulation aims to take into account the latest technical and regulatory developments at the World Forum for the Harmonisation of Vehicle Regulations (WP.29) of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE).
 3. Delegations had until 12 July 2022 to object to the delegated act. By this deadline, no delegation raised any objection. One delegation addressed comments at the Commission. After the two-month period for scrutiny expires on 9 August 2022, the delegated act will be adopted.
 4. Against this background, the Permanent Representatives Committee is invited to recommend to the Council to confirm the non-opposition to the draft Delegated Regulation, as set out in document ST 10196/22 + COR 1 + ADD 1 + ADD 1 COR 1 as an item without discussion at one of its forthcoming meetings.
