Subject: Draft REGULATION OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND OF THE COUNCIL laying down management, conservation and control measures applicable in the Indian Ocean Tuna Commission (IOTC) Area of Competence, amending Council Regulations (EC) No 1936/2001, (EC) No 1984/2003 and (EC) No 520/2007 **(first reading)**  
- Adoption of the legislative act

---

1. On 11 March 2021 the Commission sent its proposal<sup>1</sup>, based on Article 43(2) TFEU, to the Council.
2. The European Economic and Social Committee delivered its opinion on 9 June 2021<sup>2</sup>.
3. The European Data Protection Supervisor delivered his formal comments on 23 May 2022<sup>3</sup>.
4. On 4 October 2022 the European Parliament adopted its position at first reading on the Commission proposal. The outcome of voting in the European Parliament reflects the compromise agreement reached between the institutions and should, therefore, be acceptable to the Council<sup>4</sup>.

5. The Permanent Representatives Committee is therefore asked to confirm its agreement and to suggest that the Council approve the European Parliament's position, as set out in PE-CONS 38/22, as an 'A' item at a forthcoming meeting.
6. The statement for the minutes of the Council is set out in the Addendum 1 to this note.
7. If the Council approves the European Parliament's position, the legislative act will be adopted.

After being signed by the Presidents of the European Parliament and of the Council, the legislative act will be published in the *Official Journal of the European Union*.
