TRANSFER OF APPROPRIATIONS N° DEC 22/2022

INTRODUCTION

The present transfer proposes to move appropriations available on the administrative lines to the operational lines. This concerns programmes under Heading 1 (Horizon EU, CEF, Digital Europe, Single Market, Space), Heading 2b (EU4Health, EaSI, Creative Europe, Rights and Value, Justice), Heading 3 (EAGF, LIFE), Heading 4 (AMIF, BMVI) and Heading 5 (ISF, Defence Fund).

The commitment appropriations available under the administrative lines will be moved to the operational lines of the programmes. The payment appropriations will be moved to the operational lines of the programmes, where a need for reinforcement has been identified.

This transfer amounts to EUR 47,9 million in commitment and payment appropriations.

Justifications

Decreased 01 01 01

Support expenditure for Horizon Europe

This decrease in the budgetary needs is due mainly to the vacancy rate in all research DGs, which faced important delays in the recruitment process compared to the initial planning. The time needed to replace or recruit new staff turned out to be longer than in the past, and this took place in a context where there was high mobility within the research staff, as a result of the decision of Commission personnel to go working for executive agencies after the delegation package entered into effect. All these circumstances resulted in a number of vacancy posts in the research DGs that was larger than initial expected, which ultimately led to savings even after considering the higher annual salary adjustment estimated for 2022.

An amount of EUR 3,3 million can be made available in commitment and payment appropriations.

Decreased 01 01 01 02

External personnel implementing Horizon Europe-- Indirect research

This decrease in the budgetary needs is due mainly to the vacancy rate in all research DGs, which faced important delays in the recruitment process compared to the initial planning. The time needed to replace or recruit new staff turned out to be longer than in the past, and this took place in a context where there was high mobility within the research staff, as a result of the decision of Commission personnel to go working for executive agencies after the delegation package entered into effect. All these circumstances resulted in a number of vacancy posts in the research DGs that was larger than initial expected, which ultimately led to savings even after considering the higher annual salary adjustment estimated for 2022.

An amount of EUR 3,8 million can be made available in commitment and payment appropriations.

Decreased 01 01 01 03

Other management expenditure for Horizon Europe -- Indirect research

The decrease of the budgetary needs on this budget line results from the commitment taken by the Commission to reach corporate climate neutrality by 2030, which implies a reduction of its greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 60 % compared to 2005 (corresponding to approximatively -38 % compared to 2019) and a compensation for the remaining emissions through carbon removals (in 2030 at the latest). These commitments have translated into concrete actions, such as: more efficient, sustainable, and climate-resilient buildings and working space; less business travels' emissions and use more sustainable modes of transport; and the optimisation of IT operations and assets. In addition, many workshops, meetings, and events have been cancelled during 2022 due to continuation of the pandemic situation.

An amount of EUR 13,4 million can be made available in commitment and payment appropriations.

Decreased 01 01 01 72

European Research Executive Agency -- Contribution from Horizon Europe

An amount of EUR 847 096 can be made available. This surplus is mainly due to lower ICT costs than initially budgeted for in the administrative budget of the executive agency.

Decreased 01 01 01 73

European Health and Digital Executive Agency -- Contribution from Horizon Europe

An amount of EUR 1.6 million can be made available. This surplus is due to a series of factors, mainly due to a higher than expected vacancy rate and due to lower than expected non-salary expenses (the pandemic context reduced the needs in staff missions and expert meetings and the programme support expenditure was lower than expected

Increased 01 02 01 01

European Research Council

The savings identified on the administrative lines of Horizon Europe of EUR 22,9 million can be used to reinforce the European Research Council. The significant oversubscription of calls of the European Research Council result in projects of high quality being supported from the additional appropriations (and ensure full implementation of the additional appropriations).

Decreased 02 01 21 74

European Climate, Infrastructure and Environment Executive Agency -- Contribution from the Connecting Europe Facility -- Transport

The Connecting Europe Facility (CEF) administrative contribution to the European Climate, Infrastructure and Environment Executive Agency (CINEA) is reduced due to savings on the agency Title 3, in particular the charge back costs paid to the Commission for services rendered to the agency. This surplus of EUR 1,2 million should therefore be transferred to CEF operational budget line 02 03 01.

Decreased 02 01 23 73

European Health and Digital Executive Agency -- Contribution from the Connecting Europe Facility -- Digital

An amount of EUR 1,6 million can be made available. This surplus is mainly due to a slower recruitment of new staff members and lower non-salary expenses; the pandemic context reduced the needs in staff missions and expert meetings and the programme support expenditure was lower than expected.

Decreased 02 01 30 01

Support expenditure for the Digital Europe programme

An amount of EUR 3.7 million can be made available. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and the revised budgetary needs following the recently adopted Communication on Greening the Commission, the actual need of the administrative appropriations will be considerably lower than initially estimated.

Decreased 02 01 30 73

European Health and Digital Executive Agency -- Contribution from the Digital Europe programme

An amount of EUR 967 483 can be made available. This surplus is due to a slower recruitment of new staff members and lower non-salary expenses (the pandemic context reduced the needs in staff missions and expert meetings and the programme support expenditure was lower than expected).

Increased 02 03 01

Connecting Europe Facility (CEF) -- Transport

As the CEF Transport administrative contribution to CINEA is reduced due to savings on the agency Title 3, the surplus of EUR 1,2 million can be moved to CEF operational budget line 02 03 01 and will be used for actions covered under the multi-annual work programme.

Increased 02 03 03 01

Connecting Europe Facility (CEF) -- Digital

An increase of the commitment and payment appropriations (EUR 1,6 million) is proposed from the CEF administrative support line (02 01 23 73) of HaDEA to the CEF-Digital operational budget line to reinforce operational activities under the ongoing work programme.

Increased 02 04 03

Artificial intelligence

The appropriations that can be made available on the administrative lines are proposed to be used to reinforce by EUR 4,7 million the Specific Objective Artificial Intelligence of the Digital Europe Programme. More specifically, the appropriations will be used for reinforcing the budget of the "Support to the implementation of the European Digital Identity Framework" call for which there was an oversubscription.

Decreased 03 01 01

Support expenditure for the Single Market Programme

Due to the pandemic situation still affecting the first part of 2022, physical meetings could not be organized, thus creating a surplus of EUR 235 000 on the support line of the Single Market Programme.

The total planned budget of the meetings foreseen on the administrative support line of the Single Market programme, under the consumer protection strand, was decreased due to more virtual/hybrid meetings. Therefore, a surplus of EUR 560 000 can be made available.

Savings of EUR 57 000 were identified on the Single Market Programme support line, under the competition policy area.

Decreased 03 01 01 73

European Health and Digital Executive Agency -- Contribution from the Single Market Programme

An amount of EUR 1,2 million can be made available. This surplus is due to a slower recruitment of new staff members and lower non-salary expenses (the pandemic context reduced the needs in staff missions and expert meetings and the programme support expenditure was lower than expected).

Decreased 03 01 01 76

European Innovation Council and SMEs Executive Agency -- Contribution from the Single Market Programme

An amount of EUR 1,5 million can be made available. This surplus is due to lower than expected non-salary expenses, as the pandemic context reduced the needs in staff missions and expert meetings, compared to what was initially expected when preparing the draft budget 2022.

Increased 03 02 04 01

Ensuring high level of consumer protection and product safety

An amount of EUR 560 000 in commitment and payment appropriations will be used to conduct an urgent study on the implementation and the transposition of the Representative Actions Directive in the Member States (EUR 400 000) and to reinforce the communication campaign on the promotion of consumer rights to Ukrainian communities (EUR 160 000). Both actions are expected to be launched still this year.

Increased 03 02 05

Producing and disseminating high quality statistics on Europe

Concerning the implementation of the Work Programme 2022, calls for proposals have systematically resulted in higher requested amounts than the original call budget. The amount (EUR 235 000) transferred from the operational support line can therefore be used to cover such additional proposals, which are significant, eligible for financing, but would have to be rejected in the absence of additional budget.

Increased 03 02 06

Contributing to a high level of health and welfare for humans, animals and plants

In addition to the reinforcement in commitment appropriations stemming from the Draft Amending Budget No. 5/2022 (EUR 73,8 million) and autonomous transfers (EUR 610 000), this line is reinforced with EUR 2,8 million absorbing surpluses from the administrative support lines of the programme, with a view to fund Emergency Measures for Animal Health under the Food chain strand of the Single Market Programme.

Decreased 04 01 01

Support expenditure for the Space Programme of the Union

An identified surplus of EUR 344 900 in commitments and payments is due to the fact that the GNSS technical engineering support was contracted by the EU Agency for the Space Programme (EUSPA) and not by the Commission as initially planned. This amount can be made available on the operational budget lines of the Space programme, Copernicus (for the payments) and Galileo/EGNOS (for the commitments).

Moreover, an identified surplus of EUR 215 100 is due to the delay of the grant call for Space Surveillance and Tracking, which will be launched in 2023. Therefore, related experts expenditures are postponed.

Increased 04 02 01

Galileo / EGNOS

The reinforcement of EUR 344 900 in commitment appropriations will be used to reinforce the contribution agreement with the EU Agency for the Space Programme (EUSPA).

Increased 04 02 02

Copernicus

The reinforcement of EUR 560 000 in payment appropriations is needed to cover payments to the entrusted entities, and notably to the European Space Agency (ESA) for a launcher contract.

Increased 04 02 03

GOVSATCOM/SSA

An amount of EUR 215 100 in commitment appropriations is needed to reinforce the 2022 annual instalment for the indirect management and the related EU Agency for the Space Programme (EUSPA) contribution agreement.

Decreased 06 01 05 01

Support expenditure for the EU4Health Programme

The proposed decrease in commitment appropriations on budget line 06 01 05 01 comes partly as a result of the lasting effects COVID-19 has had on the organization of meetings. Physical meetings in the first half of the year were minimal, the tendency of having virtual and hybrid meetings continues, and the planned budget related to meetings was not fully consumed. Further, the fact that the The Health Emergency Preparedness and Response (HERA) is in a starting phase, and has not yet reached the full staff capacity, had an effect on the implementation of the planned budget for technical assistance. IT support budget was also partially under-implemented for the same reasons.

As a result, an amount of EUR 3,5 million in commitment appropriations can be made available.

Decreased 06 01 05 73

European Health and Digital Executive Agency -- Contribution from the EU4Health programme

An amount of EUR 3,3 million can be made available. This surplus is due to a slower recruitment of new staff members and lower non-salary expenses: the pandemic context reduced the needs in staff missions and expert meetings and the programme support expenditure was lower than expected.

Increased 06 06 01

EU4Health Programme

The additional appropriations (EUR 6,7 million) are needed to support actions envisaged under the EU4Health Programme in 2022, such as actions in the field of market research and mapping of innovative diagnostic testing solutions for HERA and in the field of mental health and health data for SANTE.

Increased 06 07 01

Emergency support within the Union

The reinforcement (EUR 6,7 million) is needed to cover the payments envisaged until the end of the year for the global vaccination measures including rollout of COVID-19 vaccines and auxiliary material in lower-middle income countries under the Emergency Support Instrument.

Decreased 07 01 01 02

Support expenditure for the Employment and Social Innovation strand

Due to the continued sanitary crisis and changes in our ways of work, some meetings were cancelled or held remotely, thus leading to savings on the support line. Therefore, EUR 160 000 can be made available.

Decreased 07 01 04 01

Support expenditure for Creative Europe

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and the revised budgetary needs following the recently adopted Communication on Greening the Commission, the actual need of the administrative appropriations will be considerably lower than initially estimated. An amount of EUR 968 939 can therefore be made available.

Decreased 07 01 05 01

Support expenditure for Citizens, Equality, Rights and Values

This support line included the funding of a network event of experts from winning cities of the Access City Award (ACA) prize which was cancelled in the last two years due to the sanitary crisis. Therefore an amount of EUR 133 364 can be made available.

Moreover, an amount of EUR 85 000 in commitment and payment appropriations will not be needed due to lower than estimated meeting costs (virtual and hybrid meetings were privileged).

Decreased 07 01 06

Support expenditure for "Justice"

An amount of EUR 130 000 in commitment and payment appropriations can be made available due to lower meeting costs (virtual and hybrid meetings were privileged).

Increased 07 02 04

ESF+ -- Employment and Social Innovation (EaSI) strand

On the operational EaSI line, two quite successful calls for proposals could be reinforced by EUR 160 000 with the aim to finance projects on the reserve list.

Increased 07 05 02

Media strand

The surplus (EUR 968 939) from the administrative support line 07 01 04 01 is proposed to be used for envisaged operational activities ("Talent and Skills") under the Creative Europe Media strand.

Increased 07 06 01

Equality and rights

The Communication and Awareness campaign on the new European Disability Strategy aims at raising awareness on the results achieved by the past strategy and on the objectives of the new one, in order to obtain consensus of the civil society around the Commission's approach. Additional services that can be funded from the surplus of EUR 133 264 identified on the support line of the Citizens, Equality, Rights and Values Programme, are for example website updates, social media paid campaign revision and champions management. Coordination work with the campaign champions is extended by four months.

Increased 07 06 04

Union values

Based on estimations on the support line for the Citizens, Equality, Rights and Values programme (07 01 05 01), an amount of EUR 85 000 in commitment and payment appropriations will not be needed due to lower than estimated meeting costs (virtual and hybrid meetings were privileged). This amount will be used to reinforce the operating grants on the operational budget line of Union Values.

Increased 07 07 03

Promoting effective access to justice

The amount of EUR 130 000 in commitment and payment appropriations not needed under the administrative support line will be used to reinforce the Access to Justice, in light of needs for e-Justice and digitalisation of justice.

Decreased 08 01 01

Support expenditure for the European Agricultural Guarantee Fund

Given the COVID-19 travelling restriction measures, planned missions could not take place and had to be cancelled. As a consequence, a surplus of EUR 50 000 has been identified on Non-operational technical assistance – EAGF. Therefore an amount of EUR 50 000 could be made available.

Increased 08 02 03 10

Public and private storage measures

The reinforcement (EUR 50 000) will be used to finance the Private Storage Aid measure, granted for the pig meat sector in March 2022 (Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2022/470) as part of the response to the serious impact of the Russian invasion on food security. Since no appropriations for storage measures were included in the voted budget 2022, the related expenditure is covered by redeployments.

Decreased 09 01 01

Support expenditure for the Programme for the Environment and Climate Action (LIFE)

Following the update of priorities of the LIFE Clean Energy Transition calls, in the context of REPowerEU plan, the programme support actions had to be adapted. The preparation of the terms of reference for the purchase of energy related databases and some consultancy work were therefore delayed. Therefore, an amount of EUR 278 251 in commitment and payment appropriations can be made available.

An addition, savings related to the changed working method in the context of COVID-19 pandemic by external service providers for an amount of EUR 550 000 in commitment and payment appropriations can be made available.

Decreased 09 01 01 74

European Climate, Infrastructure and Environment Executive Agency -- Contribution from the Programme for Environment and Climate Action (LIFE)

The LIFE administrative contribution to CINEA can be reduced as a result of difficulties to recruit specialised personnel, leading to delays and additional savings in IT and building expenditure

Increased 09 02 03

Climate change mitigation and adaptation

The increase (EUR 904 474) will allow financing procurement (IT contracts), as well as grants resulting from 2022 Open Calls. This year Calls focus on financing actions to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in the sectors not covered by the EU Emissions Trading System, actions which enhance the functioning of the Emissions Trading System, the development of land and sea management practices which have an impact on emissions and removals of emissions, and adaptation policy development.

Increased 09 02 04

Clean energy transition

The increase (EUR 500 000) will allow financing grants resulting from 2022 Open Calls. This year Calls contain the following topics: citizens in the clean energy transition, decarbonisation of buildings, supporting the clean energy transition, attracting private finance for sustainable energy.

Decreased 10 01 01

Support expenditure for the Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund

Out of the EUR 3 million available under the voted budget, only around EUR 2 million will be needed for 2022. This is due to lower costs for outsourced audit activities, less costs for experts evaluating calls for proposals under the Thematic Facility after reprioritisation of funds to Member States in view of the Ukrainian crisis, and the postponed expost evaluation of the 2014-2020 programmes following the prolonged implementation period. Thus, EUR 1,0 million is made available to the operational line of AMIF.

Increased 10 02 01

Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund

EUR 1,0 million is made available to the operational line of AMIF to support Thematic Facility activities that gathered pace during the summer and pre-financing payments.

Decreased 11 01 01

Support expenditure for the Integrated Border Management Fund -- Instrument for financial support for border management and visa

Around EUR 1,2 million of the EUR 2 million of voted budget will be needed for 2022. This is due to lower costs for outsourced audit activities, less costs for experts evaluating calls for proposals under the Thematic Facility after reprioritisation of funds to member states in view of the Ukrainian crisis, and the postponed ex-post evaluation of the 2014-2020 programmes following the prolonged implementation period. Thus, EUR 830 000 is made available to support Thematic Facility activities, such as procurement, Emergency assistance or call for proposals.

Increased 11 02 01

Instrument for financial support for border management and visa

An amount of EUR 830 000 is made available to the operational line of the Instrument for financial support for border management and visa.

Decreased 12 01 01

Support expenditure for the Internal Security Fund (ISF)

Around EUR 1,5 million out of the EUR 2,5 million of voted budget will be needed for 2022. This is due to lower costs for outsourced audit activities and the postponed ex-post evaluation of the 2014-2020 programmes following the prolonged implementation period. Thus, EUR 946 000 is made available to support Thematic Facility activities, such as procurement, Emergency assistance or call for proposals.

Increased 12 02 01

Internal Security Fund (ISF)

Due to lower costs on the administrative support line, EUR 946 000 is made available to the operational line of the Internal Security Fund to support Thematic Facility activities, such as procurement, Emergency assistance or call for proposals.

Decreased 13 01 02 01

Expenditure related to officials and temporary staff implementing the European Defence Fund -- Research

The initial amount was budgeted in order to finance the research defence staff for the full year 2022. The actual hiring of additional staff under the European Defence Fund has happened more gradually over the year, which is the main driver for the amount of EUR 900 000 which can be made available.

Increased 13 02 01

Capability development

The reinforcement by EUR 900 000 can be used to finance the higher-than-expected prefinancing payments. The related grant agreements will be signed before the end of the year.

Increased 13 03 01

Defence research

An amount of EUR 900 000 can be made available. This can be used under the research strand, which has significant possibilities to finance additional projects, based on the calls that have been launched.
