This document serves as a basis for discussion at the Working Party on Fisheries Policy. It cannot in any circumstances be regarded as the official position of the Commission. It is intended solely for those to whom it is addressed.

Updates to Commission proposal for a Council Regulation fixing for 2023 the fishing opportunities for certain fish stocks, applicable in Union waters and, for Union fishing vessels, in certain non-Union waters, as well as fixing for 2023 and 2024 such fishing opportunities for certain deep-sea fish stocks (COM(2022) 559)

1. EXPLANATORY NOTE

The European Union (EU) and the United Kingdom (UK) exercised their respective roles by consulting each other for the setting of fishing opportunities for shared stocks for 2023 and, for certain shared deep-sea stocks, for 2023 and 2024, as Parties to the Trade and Cooperation Agreement (TCA)¹, and considering their potentially differing policy considerations and orientations.

The EU consulted with the UK in accordance with i) Articles 498(2), 498(4) and 498(6) of the TCA; ii) the objectives and principles set out in Articles 2, 3, 28 and 33 of the Common Fisheries Policy (CFP) Regulation²; iii) Articles 4 and 5 of the Western Waters³ and North Sea⁴ multiannual plans (MAPs); and iv) the Council Decision establishing the position to be taken on behalf of the Union in the consultations with the UK to agree on total allowable catches⁵. In accordance with Article 494(3)(c) of the TCA, the EU based its position on the best available scientific advice, principally that provided by the International Council for the Exploration of the Sea (ICES).

These consultations were conducted, on the EU side, by the Commission in coordination with the Council. The European Parliament was informed as appropriate.

On 16 December 2022, the EU agreed with the UK on the setting of a large number of total allowable catches (TACs) for 2023 for jointly managed stocks and, for 2023 and 2024, for certain deep-sea stocks, listed in Annex 35 of the TCA. The agreement in principle was laid down in the Written Record for 2023, which was endorsed by the Council on 20 December 2022 and signed by the Heads of Delegation of the UK, and by the Commission

Regulation (EU) 2019/472 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 19 March 2019 establishing a multiannual plan for stocks fished in the Western Waters and adjacent waters, and for fisheries exploiting those stocks, amending Regulations (EU) 2016/1139 and (EU) 2018/973, and repealing Council Regulations (EC) No 811/2004, (EC) No 2166/2005, (EC) No 388/2006, (EC) No 509/2007 and (EC) No 1300/2008 (OJ L 83 of 25.3.2019, p. 1).

Regulation (EU) 2018/973 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 4 July 2018 establishing a multiannual plan for demersal stocks in the North Sea and the fisheries exploiting those stocks, specifying details of the implementation of the landing obligation in the North Sea and repealing Council Regulations (EC) No 676/2007 and (EC) No 1342/2008 (OJ L 179 of 16.7.2018, p. 1).

Council Decision (EU) 2021/1875 of 22 October 2021 concerning the position to be adopted on behalf of the Union in the annual consultations with the United Kingdom to agree on total allowable catches (OJ L 378, 26.10.2021, p. 6).

representative on behalf of the EU on the same day, in accordance with Article 498(6) of the TCA and in line with Council Decision (EU) 2021/1875.

It is therefore necessary to implement TACs corresponding to fishing opportunities agreed in the Written Record for 2023 and, for certain deep-sea stocks, for 2023 and 2024, into the EU legal framework. The Written Record also documents certain fish stocks that are present in EU waters only (Annex 36.F of the TCA) and stocks that are only consultative and listed in Annex 37 of the TCA. Such fishing opportunities for 2023 and 2024 will allow that fishing activities are environmentally sustainable in the long-term and that they are managed in a way that is consistent with the following objectives: (i) achieving economic, social and employment benefits; (ii) contributing to the availability of food supplies, and (iii) promoting a level-playing field for EU operators as regards stocks that are shared with the UK.

In line with Article 498 of the TCA, the TACs agreed by the EU and the UK, and documented in the Written Record for 2023, correspond to the EU quota shares set out in Annex 35 of the TCA and Annex 36.F of the TCA. The Commission's general approach to setting those TACs is based on the ICES advice for 2023, and is in line with the objectives set out in Articles 494(1) and 494(2) of the TCA and with the principles referred to in Article 494(3) of the TCA.

The consultations resulted in 39 TACs set in line with ICES MSY advice, in addition to seabass (a non-quota stock), which was also set at MSY level. For seven TACs for stocks with MSY assessment and zero catch advice, the consultations resulted in TACs not being set in line with ICES advice. That is, for four demersal stocks (Cod Celtic Sea, Cod West of Scotland, Cod in the Irish Sea, and Whiting Irish Sea), for one pelagic stock (Western horse mackerel) and for one deep-sea stock (Red Seabream), TACs were agreed with the UK at by-catch levels. For one stock (Herring Celtic Sea), a monitoring TAC was agreed with the UK, following the ICES advice regarding the level of such TAC.

- Cod Celtic Sea is a target stock under the Western Waters MAP. A TAC was agreed between the EU and the UK for unavoidable by-catches in the mixed demersal fishery at a level of 644 tonnes (a roll-over from 2022), staying within the F_{MSY} ranges and leading to an increase in biomass greater than 90 %.
- Cod West of Scotland is a by-catch stock under the Western Waters MAP. A TAC was agreed with the UK at 1 210 tonnes, staying within the F_{MSY} ranges. This will result in an increase in the stock size above 12% compared to the 2022 biomass level.
- Whiting Irish Sea is a by-catch stock under the Western Waters MAP. The EU and UK agreed to roll over the TAC and set it at 721 tonnes, as there was no new advice for 2023.

In relation to the above, the Commission has recently adopted a Delegated Regulation⁶ introducing remedial measures for Cod and Whiting, and extending the existing technical measures until 31 December 2023, with the aim of reducing by-catches of *inter alia* Cod in the Celtic Sea and West of Scotland, and Whiting.

- For Western horse mackerel, to avoid a choke effect that would lead to the premature closure of other important fisheries, a by-catch only TAC was agreed at 13 400 t, leading to an estimated increase of a 4.96% in the spawning stock biomass (SSB) in 2024 compared to 2023. This is based on the Pelagic Advisory Council's Rebuilding Plan for this stock, which was reviewed by ICES and considered precautionary.
- Red Seabream is a by-catch stock under the Western Waters MAP. A TAC was agreed with the UK at 105 tonnes based on a rollover to avoid the choking of the targeted and associated hake, megrim and anglerfish fisheries.
 In relation to the above, and as a follow-up to commitments in the Written Record to work jointly in the Specialised Committee on Fisheries (SCF), the Commission will propose new technical measures with the aim of reducing unwanted catches and supporting the long-term recovery of this stock.

The consultations also covered 21 TACs for stocks with precautionary advice (see the Annex for further detail). In agreeing TACs with the UK, the EU took into account the corresponding ICES headline advice and the precautionary approach provided for in Article 2(2) of the CFP Regulation. Except for 3 stocks, those TACs have been agreed in line with, or below, the ICES advice levels.

- Regarding Blue Ling (International 12) and Blue Ling North Sea, TACs were agreed with UK above the precautionary advice at respectively 77 tonnes and 27 tonnes in order to avoid the choking of other fisheries to which Blue Ling is a by-catch.
- Regarding Black Scabbardfish the TAC was agreed with the UK at 1 813 tonnes for the whole stock because of technical issues with the ICES advice that, unlike in previous years, was not split between areas. For this reason, the TAC was agreed only for 2023. The EU and the UK will engage in the SCF in 2023 with a view to agreeing on an appropriate way to split the total stock advice for BSF/56712- and BSF/8910-.

Finally, 10 TACs for stocks with combined MSY and precautionary advice have been agreed with the UK in line with the ICES advice. This includes the five Skates and Rays group TACs, Megrims in the Celtic Sea and Bay of Biscay, Nephrops in the Celtic Sea and North Sea, and Greater silver smelt in Western waters.

TACs that deviate by more than 20% from the previously established TAC level

At the time of the adoption of the Western Waters and North Sea MAPs, the Commission made a statement that, where it proposes the setting of TACs that deviate by more than 20% from the previously established TAC level, these cases will be listed in the explanatory memorandum of the Commission proposal, providing, where appropriate, the underlying reasons for the TAC variations.

Stocks removed from the list of prohibited species

Picked dogfish⁸: while between 2010 and 2022, all targeted fishery was prohibited, the ICES advice for 2023 indicates the possibility of reopening the fishery^{9. The EU and the UK} therefore agreed to remove picked dogfish from the list of prohibited species.

The ICES advice was historically split into three TACs (DGA/03-A, DGS/2AC4-C and DGS/15X14), of which only one is covered in the TCA (DGS/15X14). The EU and the UK agreed that the full amount of advised catches would inform the 2023 TACs and that the splitting would be based on the relative shares from 2009 (the last year when a targeted fishery was possible).

Taking into account the biological distribution of the stock and bearing in mind the importance of responsible international fisheries management, the EU and the UK agreed that for 2023 the overall catches allowed should take account of other coastal States catches, set for 2023 at 1900 tonnes (11% of the ICES advice), as derived from historic catch data.

The EU and the UK agreed to apply the TACs for 2023 as set out in the table below:

Given that, between 2010 and 2022 all targeted fishing was prohibited, the EU and the UK agreed on an additional precautionary measure, to ensure that picked dogfish fishery only expands gradually and with significant caution. They agreed that it is necessary to deter directed fisheries targeting aggregations of mature females, in order to protect a component of the stock that is particularly vulnerable to fishing mortality.

To this end, the EU and the UK agreed to introduce a maximum size of 100 cm. Such a measure is functionally linked to the TAC for the stock, as without such measure the TAC level would not ensure sufficient protection of pupping females, which constitute a particularly vulnerable part of the population.

Inter-annual flexibility

The EU agreed with the UK that the inter-annual flexibility will not apply to the following stocks: i) Blue ling in international waters of ICES 1 and 2 (BLI/12INT-), ii) Blue ling North Sea (BLI/24-), iii) Blue ling in Skagerrak (BLI/03/A-), iv) Cod Irish Sea (COD/07A), v) Cod West of Scotland (COD/5BE6A), vi) Cod Celtic Sea (COD/7XAD34), vii) Herring Celtic Sea (HER/7G-K), viii) Horse mackerel (Western) (JAX/2A-14)¹⁰, xix) Red Seabream (SBR/678-), and x) Whiting Irish Sea (WHG/07A).

Discard exemptions

The EU notified the UK on 9 August 2022 of amendments made to Commission Delegated Regulations (EU) 2020/2014¹¹ and (EU) 2020/2015¹², specifying details of implementation of the landing obligation for certain fisheries in the North Sea and Western Waters respectively. The UK informed the EU on 7 October 2022 that it was not proposing any changes to its exemptions to the landing obligation.

TAC deductions

The fishing opportunities for stocks of species falling under the landing obligation pursuant to Article 15 of Regulation (EU) 1380/2013 take into account the fact that discarding is in principle no longer allowed. The amounts that, by way of exception, may continue to be discarded during the operation of the landing obligation, should be deducted from the total catches.

Seabass

Northern seabass is a non-quota stock that the EU shares with the UK. As agreed in the Written Record of the 2023 consultations, it is proposed to establish catch limitation measures for 2023 for this stock, in line with the ICES MSY advice.

Northern Albacore

The EU and the UK have agreed a reciprocal access in 2023 to target an initial total of 280 tonnes of northern albacore in their exclusive economic zones¹³, in line with the conditions set out in the Written Record. It is therefore proposed to amend Annex ID on the fishing opportunities table for albacore (*Thunnus alalunga*) in the Atlantic Ocean.

2. <u>AMENDMENTS TO ENACTING TERMS OF THE COMMISSION PROPOSAL COM(2022)559</u>

Recital 48 is replaced by the following:

"(48) On 16 December 2022, the Union agreed with the United Kingdom on the setting of a large number of TACs for 2022 for stocks listed in Annex 35 to the TCA. The outcome of the consultations was documented in the Written Record, which was endorsed by the Council on 20 December 2022 and signed by the Head of Delegation of the United Kingdom and by the Commission representative on behalf of the Union, in accordance with Article 498(6) of the TCA and Council Decision (EU) 2021/1875¹⁴. The Written Record is a result of consultations conducted by the Union with the United Kingdom in accordance with Articles 498(2), 498(4) and 498(6) of TCA, with the objectives and principles set out in Articles 2, 3, 28 and 33 of Regulation (EU) No 1380/2013, Articles 4 and 5 of the Western Waters and North Sea MAPs, and Council Decision (EU) 2021/1875. The Union position was based during the consultations on the best available scientific advice, principally that provided by the International Council for the Exploration of the Sea (ICES) in accordance with Article 494(3)(c) of the TCA. The relevant fishing opportunities should be fixed at the level set out in that Written Record, and the other measures functionally linked to the fishing opportunities also set out in that Written Record should be implemented in Union law.

Recital 49 is replaced by the following:

(49)There are certain shared stocks jointly managed with the United Kingdom for which ICES, while assessing them against MSY, has issued scientific advice for zero catches. If TACs for those stocks were established at the level indicated in such advice, the obligation to land all catches both in the Union and United Kingdom waters, including by-catches from those stocks, in mixed fisheries, would lead to the phenomenon of 'choke species'. In order to balance the need for the continuation of those mixed fisheries in view of the potentially severe socioeconomic implications of complete interruption of those fisheries with the need to achieve a good biological status for those stocks, and taking into account the difficulty of fishing all stocks in a mixed fishery at MSY at the same time, the Union and the United Kingdom agreed that it is appropriate to establish specific TACs for by-catches for those stocks. Those TACs should be set at levels that ensure that the mortality for those stocks is decreased and that provide incentives to improve selectivity and to avoid by-catches of those stocks. The levels of the fishing opportunities for those stocks should be established in accordance with the Written Record in order to ensure a level playing field for Union operators while providing for the significant recovery of the biomass of those stocks.

In Recitals 50, 51, 52 the square brackets are deleted.

The following Recitals are inserted:

- (52a) Given that the biomass of the stocks of Blue ling in international waters of ICES 1 and 2 (BLI/12INT-), Blue ling North Sea (BLI/24-), Blue ling in Skagerrak (BLI/03/A-), Cod Irish Sea (COD/07A), Cod West of Scotland (COD/5BE6A), Cod Celtic Sea (COD/7XAD34), Herring Celtic Sea (HER/7G-K), Horse mackerel (Western) (JAX/2A-14)¹⁵, Red Seabream (SBR/678-) and Whiting Irish Sea (WHG/07A) are below the biomass reference points (B_{lim}), the Union and the United Kingdom agreed that it is necessary, as an additional remedial measure, that Member States do not apply Article 15(9) of Regulation (EU) No 1380/2013 in respect of these stocks for transfers from 2022 to 2023, so that catches in 2023 will not exceed the TAC established for those stocks. The United Kingdom has also agreed to apply the same measure in its legal order.
- (52b) The Union and the United Kingdom agreed that, in order to protect a component of the picked dogfish (*Squalus acanthias*) stock that is particularly vulnerable to fishing mortality, it is appropriate to deter directed fisheries targeting aggregations of mature females. To this end, the Union and the United Kingdom agreed that a maximum size of 100 cm should be respected, when targeting picked dogfish. Such a measure is functionally linked to the TAC for the stock, as without such measure the TAC level alone would not ensure sufficient protection of pupping females, which constitute a particularly vulnerable part of the population.
- (52c) The Union and the United Kingdom agreed a reciprocal access in 2023 to target an initial total of 280 tonnes of northern albacore in their exclusive economic zones. This excludes access to areas covered under Article 5(3) of the CFP.

Article 10 is replaced by the following:

Article 10 Measures on European seabass fisheries in ICES divisions 4b, 4c and 6a and ICES subarea 7

- 1. It shall be prohibited for Union fishing vessels, as well as for any commercial fisheries from shore: a) to fish for European seabass (*Dicentrarchus labrax*) in ICES divisions 4b and 4c and in ICES subarea 7; or b) to retain on board, tranship, relocate or land European seabass caught in that area.
- 2. The prohibition set out in paragraph 1 shall not apply to by-catches of seabass in shore-based commercial netting activities. This exemption applies to historic numbers of beach nets set at pre-2017 levels. Shore-based commercial netting activities shall not target seabass and only unavoidable by-catches of seabass may be landed.

By way of derogation from paragraph 1, in January 2023 and from 1 April to 31 December 3. 2023, Union fishing vessels in ICES divisions 4b, 4c, 7d, 7e, 7f and 7h may fish for, retain

- on board, tranship, relocate or land European seabass caught in that area with the following gear and within the following limits:
- (a) using demersal trawls¹⁶, for unavoidable by-catches not exceeding 3.8 tonnes and 5 % of the weight of the total catches of marine organisms on board caught by the fishing vessel concerned per fishing trip;
- (b) using seines¹⁷, for unavoidable by-catches not exceeding 3.8 tonnes and 5 % of the weight of the total catches of marine organisms on board caught by the fishing vessel concerned per fishing trip;
- (c) using hooks and lines¹⁸, not exceeding 6.2 tonnes per fishing vessel;
- (d) using fixed gillnets¹⁹, for unavoidable by-catches not exceeding 1.6 tonnes per fishing vessel.

The derogations set out in the first subparagraph, point (c), shall apply to Union fishing vessels that have recorded catches of European seabass using hooks and lines over the period from 1 July 2015 to 30 September 2016.

The derogations set out in the first subparagraph, point (d), shall apply to Union fishing vessels that have recorded catches of European seabass using fixed gillnets over the period from 1 July 2015 to 30 September 2016.

In the case of a replacement of a Union fishing vessel, Member States may allow the derogations to apply to another Union fishing vessel provided that the number of Union fishing vessels subject to each of the derogations and their overall fishing capacity do not increase.

4. The catch limits set out in paragraph 3 shall not be transferable between fishing vessels and, where a bi-monthly limit applies, from one calendar two-month period to another.

For Union fishing vessels using more than one gear in two calendar months, the lowest catch limit set out in paragraph 3 for either gear shall apply.

Member States shall report to the Commission all catches of European seabass per type of gear no later than 15 days after the end of each month.

- 5. In recreational fisheries, including from shore, in ICES divisions 4b, 4c, 6a and 7a to 7k:
 - (a) from 1 January to 28 February 2023:

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All types of demersal trawls (OTB, OTT, PTB, TBB, TBN, TBS and TB).

 - (i) not more than two specimens of European seabass may be caught and retained per fisher per day;
 - (ii) the minimum size of European seabass retained shall be 42 cm;
 - (iii) fixed nets shall not be used to catch or retain European seabass.
- 6. Paragraph 5 shall be without prejudice to more stringent national measures on recreational fisheries.
