Ad "B" item 5: Regulation on methane emissions reduction in the energy sector General approach

STATEMENT BY LUXEMBOURG, AUSTRIA AND BELGIUM

"The signatories believe that the methane regulation could be a valuable tool to significantly contribute to the reduction of methane emissions in the energy sector. As confirmed by recent reports from the European Environment Agency and the International Energy Agency, a strong reduction of methane emissions is one of the most important measures the EU can take in the short term to slow down climate change, but also a key action to contribute to the security of gas supply. Therefore, the signatories regret the lack of ambition in the overall approach and calls for an increase in ambition during the trilogues in order to strengthen the EU's aspiration and credibility to be a leader in reducing methane emissions, one of the main objectives of the Regulation as well as of the EU's commitment under the Global Methane Pledge."

General approach

STATEMENT BY AUSTRIA, DENMARK, ESTONIA, GERMANY, GREECE, LUXEMBOURG, PORTUGAL AND SPAIN

"We the undersigned Member States,

Support the 2030 renewables target of 45% as proposed by the Commission in its REPowerEU proposal amending Directive (EU) 2018/2001 on the promotion of the use of energy from renewable sources.

Given the current energy crisis and the need for a swift reduction of the EU's dependency on fossil sources, in particular from Russia, while increasing security of supply, we think that an increase of the renewables target to 45% is indispensable.

To this end, we call for an increase in ambition during the tripartite meetings ('trilogues') between the Council, Parliament and the Commission in order to strengthen the EU's aspiration and ability to rapidly scale-up renewables.

We also acknowledge the need to improve permitting procedures for large-scale renewable energy projects. To this end we encourage the Commission to evaluate the effectiveness of the framework in due time, and if necessary submit proposals before 2024.

It is a requisite to regain control over energy prices rendering them affordable again for our consumers, to ensure Europe remains on track with its commitment under the Paris Agreement to protect our climate."

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
