


Delegations will find attached the following tables regarding EU criminal law instruments that have been adopted since the entry into force of the Lisbon Treaty (1.12.2009):


- 1) a table (with blue colours) setting out the dates of adoption of Directives and Regulations in the field on EU criminal law (both COPEN and DROIPEN, with the exception of instruments relating to bodies/agencies);
- 2) a table (with yellow colours) setting out the dates for the implementation/application of these instruments in national law (with the exception of Regulation (EU) 2019/816 on ECRIS-TCN, which should be 'implemented' 'as soon as possible');
- 3) a table (with red colours) setting out the dates when the Commission should submit the (first) reports regarding these instruments.

The last page contains information provided by the Commission services on the implementation of Directive 2011/99/EU on the European Protection Order (EPO) and Directive 2014/41/EU on the European Investigation Order (EIO).

**Information by the Commission services on the implementation of Directive 2011/99/EU on the European Protection Order (EPO) and Directive 2014/41/EU on the European Investigation Order (EIO)**

The Member States are kindly reminded that while the Council General Secretariat is still competent to receive notifications in respect of Framework Decisions, the Commission is solely competent to receive notifications in respect of Directives. Therefore, Member States should send their notifications under Directives directly to the Commission.

**As regards the EPO Directive:**

15 Member States (AT, CY, CZ, EE, ES, FI, HR, HU, IT, LV, LU, MT, NL, PL, SE) and UK have sent their notifications to the Commission via the e-Justice Portal or via the MNE system (in a separate file).

**As regards the EIO Directive:**

24 Member States (AT, BE, BG, CY, CZ, DE, EE, EL, ES, FI, FR, HR, HU, IT, LT, LV, LU, NL, PL, PT, RO, SE, SK, SI) and the UK have sent their notifications to the Commission.

The information is available on the website of the European Judicial Network.

All other Member States are kindly reminded to notify to the Commission via the MNE system (in a separate file) the missing information (such as competent authorities and languages accepted for translation) as required under the EPO Directive and the EIO Directive.
