Subject:	Draft Council conclusions on European Court of Auditors' Special Report No 22/2023 entitled "Offshore renewable energy in the EU: Ambitious plans for growth but sustainability remains a challenge" - Approval

Following the tasking by the Permanent Representatives Committee, the Energy Working Party discussed the European Court of Auditors' Special Report No 22/2023¹ entitled "Offshore renewable energy in the EU: Ambitious plans for growth but sustainability remains a challenge", at its meeting of 9 January 2024 and agreed on the draft text of the Council conclusions.

In accordance with the Council conclusions of 8 May 2000 on improving the examination of special reports drawn up by the Court of Auditors², the Permanent Representatives Committee is therefore invited to suggest to the Council to adopt, under the "A" items of a forthcoming session, the Council conclusions as set out in the Annex.

Draft Council conclusions on European Court of Auditors' Special Report No 22/2023 entitled “Offshore renewable energy in the EU – Ambitious plans for growth but sustainability remains a challenge”.

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION:

1. THANKS the European Court of Auditors for the Special Report 22/2023 entitled "Offshore renewable energy in the EU – Ambitious plans for growth but sustainability remains a challenge".
2. RECOGNISES the focus of the Special Report on offshore renewable energy in the European Union.
3. RECALLS that the Council of the European Union and the European Parliament have recently agreed on most of the legislation under the ‘Fit for 55’ package, setting the framework for the implementation of the Union's 2030 climate and energy targets; and in this context HIGHLIGHTS the revisions of the Energy Efficiency Directive and the Renewable Energy Directive including as regards the provisions on facilitating permit-granting for joint offshore renewable energy projects³.
4. RECALLS the importance of offshore renewable energy to contribute to achieve the Unions climate objectives, competitive energy prices and a resilient energy supply in Europe.

5. HIGHLIGHTS the different non-binding agreements to cooperate on goals for offshore renewable generation to be deployed within each sea basin by 2050 with intermediate steps in 2040 and 2030⁴ concluded pursuant to Article 14(1) of the TEN-E Regulation⁵. The combined figures give an overall ambition of installing approximately 111 GW of offshore renewable generation capacity by the end of this decade.
6. TAKES NOTE of the ongoing discussions in respect of the different EU sea basins as well as the most recent declarations and joint statements on some sea basins that further increase the ambitions⁶ and identify actions to deliver ambitions⁷.
7. LOOKS FORWARD to the upcoming Cross-Border Cost Allocation Guidance and European Network of Transmission System Operators for Electricity high level strategic integrated offshore network development plan for each sea-basin as required by the TEN-E, as part of each ten-year network development plan cycle.
8. ACKNOWLEDGES the importance of the National Energy and Climate Plans set by the Member States for reaching the different objectives
9. TAKES good note of the observations, conclusions and recommendations in the Special Report; including the need to address the different challenges in a structural way, and in particular the call for accelerated coordinated sustainable deployment of offshore renewable energy.
