Subject:	Swedish Green Party Request for internal review under Title IV of the Aarhus Regulation in relation to COUNCIL REGULATION (EU) 2023/2638 of 20 November 2023 fixing the fishing opportunities for certain fish stocks and groups of fish stocks applicable in the Baltic Sea for 2024 and amending Regulation (EU) 2023/194 as regards certain fishing opportunities in other waters - Approval of a letter

I. INTRODUCTION

1. On 17 January 2024, the Council received, on behalf of the Swedish Green Party, a request for internal review of certain provisions of Council Regulation (EU) 2023/2638 of 20 November 2023 fixing the fishing opportunities for certain fish stocks and groups of fish stocks applicable in the Baltic Sea for 2024 and amending Regulation (EU) 2023/194 as regards certain fishing opportunities in other waters.

2. This request is based on Article 10 of Regulation No 1367/2006 ('the Aarhus Regulation')¹, as amended by Regulation (EU) 2021/1767², and on Commission Decision (EU) 2023/748 of 11 April 2023³. The amended Aarhus Regulation allows any non-governmental organisation that meets the criteria set out in Article 11 of that Regulation to submit a request for internal review to the Union institution or body that has adopted an administrative act containing provisions that may infringe environmental law within the meaning of that Regulation.
3. The Swedish Green Party requests the Council to review Council Regulation (EU) 2023/2638 of 20 November 2024 in accordance with the Aarhus Regulation and, more specifically, to amend the fishing opportunities (fixed in the form of total allowable catches — TACs) for Central Baltic herring and Bothnian herring in order to bring them in line with environmental law within the meaning of the Aarhus Regulation.
4. The Working Party on Fisheries Policy examined the request for internal review on 9 February 2024 and 11 April 2024. It reached an agreement on the draft reply to the Swedish Green Party on 11 April 2024.⁴
5. The draft reply (ST 8002/24) explains in detail why, after careful examination, the Council considers that the request is not admissible since the Swedish Green Party is not a non-governmental organization ("NGO") within the meaning of Article 11 of the Aarhus Regulation.

6. The reply, when approved by the Council, would constitute the Council's decision on the above-mentioned request for internal review.
