- Security



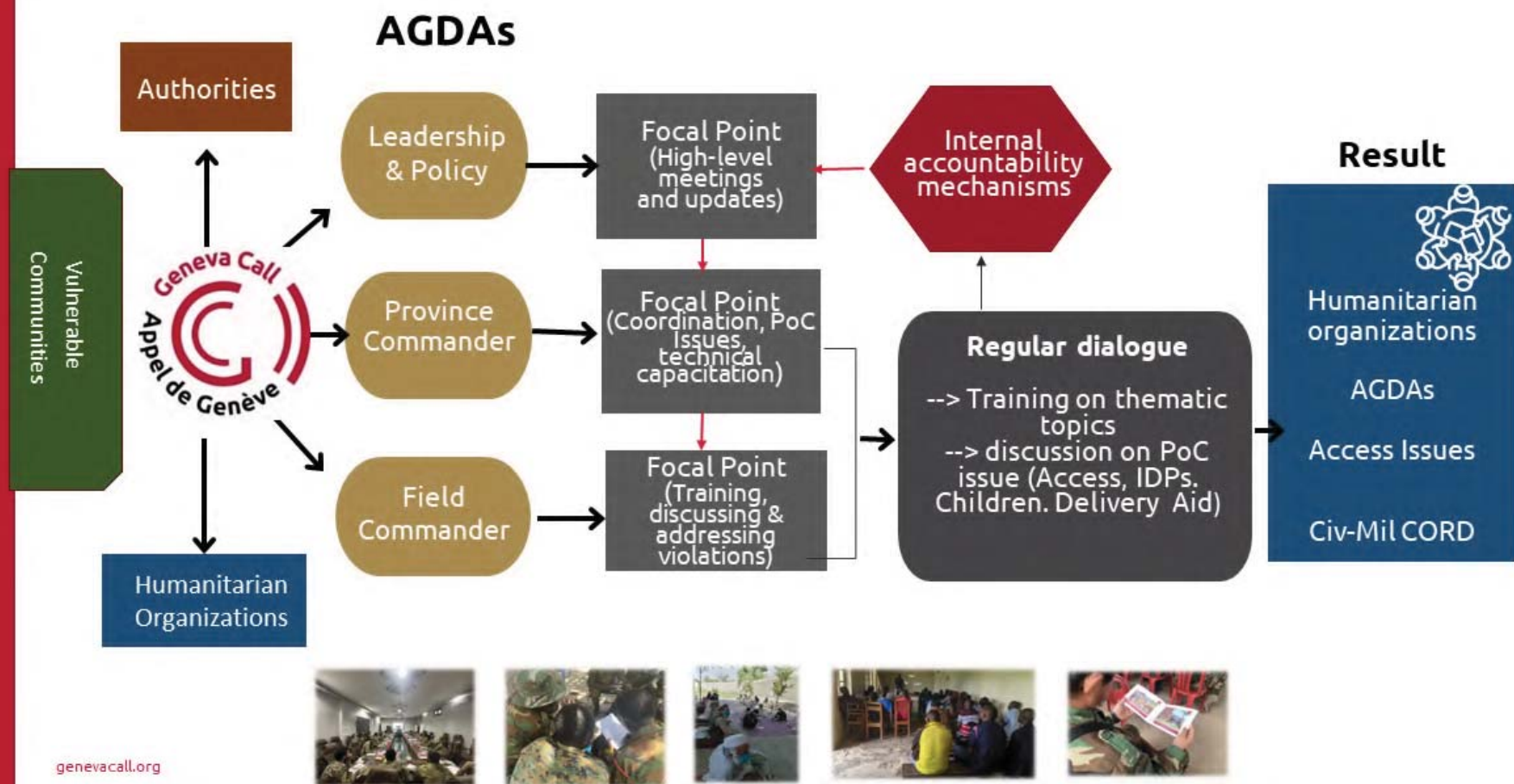

How?

- Regular and low profile with with key stakeholders
- Central and provincial level
- Building trust with authorities and communities
- Based on an understanding of local power structures and needs
- Show benefits for everyone of humanitarian work
- Clear communication
- Respect of local customs

Recommendations for EU

- Public support for unimpeded humanitarian access in Afghanistan
- Direct interaction with Afghan authorities to advocate for access
- Support of programs on humanitarian engagement and interventions focusing on building relationships between local communities and AGDAs
