Geneva Call – Sahel

1. Context Evolution and Trends

- Intensification violence & methods warfare
- Involvement of civilians in hostilities in the form of self-defense groups
- Disinformation/social media = violence
- Political instability, attempt coup d'Etat and restrictions of civil liberties
- European diplomatic disengagement (bilateral cooperation and funds)
- Spill over on coastal countries

2. Concerns on Protection of Civilians

- Over 2M displaced with limited access to services
- Communities targeted (associated to parties to the conflict no principle of distinction)
- Humanitarians and local CSO face further restrictions no access to populations under AGDA control
- Blocked localities/towns with limited access to services dangerous farming = food insecurity
- · Children recruited, public infrastructures misused/targeted
- Civilian casualties and gender violence possibly under-reported

Geneva Call – Sahel

3. Geneva Call response to PoC concerns

- Engagement authorities capital and local to advocate for humanitarian access
- Capacity building and advocacy on IHL with self-defense forces and authorities
- Awareness IHL common elements with Islam and local cultural norms with religious and community leaders
- Capacity building and protection dialogue between community leaders
- Results; over 12 schools operational thanks to the relocation of armed self-defense group sites, decreased target to communities, children age verification methods preventing recruitment, access to farming granted, humanitarian access negotiated

4. Enable the humanitarian response and enhance PoC

- EU/European Diplomatic engagement helps advocating for humanitarian & peacebuilding responses + accountability vs restrictive environment
- Funds towards supporting humanitarian assistance and also dialogue and advocacy activities enabling it
- Optimize West African States and Sahel links prevent spill over effect (extremism or military regime)
