d) Detailed grounds for the decrease

The Commission proposes the re-allocation of EUR 3 million from the budget line 19 04 01 - Improving the reliability of electoral processes, in particular by means of election observation missions - under the European Instrument for Democracy and Human Rights (EIDHR) to the Humanitarian aid budget line 23 02 01 to reinforce EU's support in Bosnia and Herzegovina related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Due to the COVID-19 crisis, three planned election observation missions in Jordan, Suriname and Afghanistan can now not take place, leaving a surplus of EUR 5 million in the budget line for Election Observation Missions (EOM) under the EIDHR. The Commission therefore proposes EUR 3 million to be transferred to the Humanitarian aid to support to COVID-19 related actions. Another EUR 2 million have been re-allocated through an internal Commission transfer to an ongoing action under the Partnership Instrument to cover activities related to COVID-19 in Latin America.

Croatia has further tightened the border regime due to COVID-19 restrictions and Bosnia and Herzegovina is becoming a bottleneck for refugees and migrants with overstretched reception capacities for stranded migrants. The situation is further exacerbated by a lack of support to refugees and migrants by the local authorities, the worsening of the humanitarian situation in the Una Sana Canton and further restrictions on movement by the cantonal authorities.

This additional funding for Bosnia and Herzegovina will support the provision of comprehensive health and protection assistance for refugees and migrants accommodated in the temporary reception facilities, outreach assistance and child protection including adequate care for unaccompanied minors.

d) Detailed grounds for the decrease

The Commission proposes to re-allocate EUR 27,9 million in commitment appropriations from budget line 21 02 02 - Cooperation with Asia - under the Development Cooperation Instrument (DCI) to the Humanitarian aid budget line 23 02 01 to reinforce the EU's response to the COVID-19 crisis in Pakistan.

As of 20 April, Pakistan had reported almost 8 500 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and approximately 175 associated deaths. A high number of infections is expected due to the weak healthcare system and the fact that a large part of the population already suffers from severe malnutrition. In the districts of Sindh and Baluchistan, which are most affected, there are more than 3 million people in phases classified as 'Food Crisis and Emergency' according to the Food and Agriculture Organization's Integrated Phase Classification on food insecurity.

The re-allocation is proposed because of Humanitarian aid's capacity to react quickly thanks to the immediate operational capacity of the humanitarian aid partners. The funds will help address Pakistan's immediate needs by supporting activities such as medical procurement (including Personal Protective Equipment), water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) items and hygiene promotion activities, as well as communication outreach and awareness raising. EUR 5 million will be used for emergency food distribution. Special attention will be paid to vulnerable groups, including Afghan refugees, whose number is estimated at 3 million.

d) Detailed grounds for the decrease

The Commission proposes to re-allocate EUR 10 million in commitment appropriations from the budget line 21 02 04 - Cooperation with the Middle East - under the Development Cooperation Instrument (DCI) to the Humanitarian aid budget line 23 02 01 to reinforce the programme in support of the Iraq National Health Security Action Plan, implemented through the World Health Organisation.

The COVID-19 outbreak is adding yet another layer of vulnerability to the complex situation in Iraq. As of 20 April, the country reported 1 539 confirmed cases, but the scale of the pandemic is likely to be significantly under-reported, also due to very limited testing capacity. The entire health system is under heavy strain and there are major concerns about the impact of the virus on the most vulnerable groups, in particular refugees and internally displaced persons (IDPs) living in and out of camps, low-income families depending on daily and seasonal employment, and people in prisons and detention centres. Vulnerable refugees and IDPs have been severely affected, as the restrictions on movement adopted by the authorities to slow the spread of the virus have drastically reduced day job opportunities, depleted their cash reserves and food supplies. Camps lock down and inability to access food markets are worsening the food security conditions in the IDPs camps.

The re-allocation is proposed because of Humanitarian aid's capacity to react quickly thanks to the immediate operational capacity of the humanitarian aid partners. The funds will go to support:

- Health: supporting the Iraqi health system to respond to the outbreak through centralised procurement of protective equipment (PPE) and medical supplies, testing capacities, detection, referrals, isolation and treatment capacities, awareness raising and capacity building;
- Water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) measures, with a specific focus on IDPs camps, as well as prisons and detention centres, through hygiene and community awareness activities and provision of prevention and hygiene kits:
- Food security: addressing and mitigating the immediate socio-economic consequences of the pandemic for the
 most vulnerable groups, with a specific focus on IDPs in camps, through cash based interventions and emergency
 food rations.

d) Detailed grounds for the decrease

The Commission proposes to re-allocate EUR 15 million in commitment appropriations from the budget line 21 02 05 - Cooperation with Afghanistan - under the Development Cooperation Instrument (DCI) to the Humanitarian aid budget line 23 02 01 to reinforce EU's response to the COVID-19 crisis in Afghanistan. As of 20 April, 996 confirmed cases have been reported.

The re-allocation is proposed because of Humanitarian aid's capacity to react quickly thanks to the immediate operational capacity of the humanitarian aid partners, as well as the need to also support activities in Taliban controlled areas. The Commission humanitarian partners have access in these areas and can thus ensure effective control over the dissemination of the virus.

The additional funds will finance the following activities, among others:

- Procurement of protective equipment/tests/laboratory supply, expanding the bed capacity in isolation centres, with a focus on Western regions;
- Ensuring infection control measures/triage/referrals are enforced within the Afghan Red Crescent network of mobile clinics/health facilities. The International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) and the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) will coordinate on this action.
- Reinforcing the support to Primary Health care providers to ensure infection control measures/triage/referrals/health promotion and communication at primary health care level.
