Dear Colleagues,

By letter of 27 January I informed you about the temporary reintroduction of targeted border controls at all internal Belgian borders for a period of 10 days, and this in accordance with article 28 of the Schengen Borders Code in order to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus.

By the same letter I informed you of the decision of the Belgian government to restrict non-essential travel to and from Belgium for a limited duration from 27 January until 1 March.

As the epidemiological situation and the risk for public health did not change fundamentally since that date, the targeted checks to enforce these travel restrictions have to continue. In line with article 28 (3) of the Schengen Border Code, I inform you that, for a further period of 20 days, from 6 until 25 February, some of these checks will be carried out at the internal borders.

I reiterate that no internal borders will be closed and that all checks will be carried out in a proportionate and non-discriminatory way, while ensuring the smooth border crossing for essential travel, the supply chain and the local cross-border traffic.
